

HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

Molasses Cake.—Two eggs, butter the size of an egg, half cup of water, 1 cup of sugar, 1 cup molasses, 1/2 teaspoonful of soda, 2 cups of flour; bake in 2 tins.

Cracker Fruit Pudding.—Six crackers pounded fine, 1 quart boiling milk, 1 spoonful flour, 1 cup brown sugar, 6 eggs, raisins and currants; all kinds of spice. Bake.

Orange Iceing to put Between the Cakes.—Take a 1/2 pound of powdered sugar, rind and juice of one large or two small ones, beat until very light and spread between the cakes when cold.

Coffee Cakes.—One cup butter, one-half cup sugar, one cup molasses, one teaspoonful seleratus dissolved in a cup of strong coffee, one nutmeg, one teaspoonful of cloves, one cinnamon, five cups of flour, and one cup of raisins chopped.

Buns.—One cup of milk, one cup of sugar, one cup of yeast, flour to make a batter. Let rise over night, then add one-half cup melted butter, a cup of sugar, flour to knead it, and let it rise again, then roll and cut into cakes and let it rise again.

Lemon Jelly for the Cake.—Grate 1 lemon and slice very thin. Take one cup of sugar, 1 egg well beaten, and 3 tablespoonfuls of water; put all together and let it boil 10 minutes in a saucepan, set in hot water. When cold place between the cakes.

Orange Sponge Cake.—Take 2 cups of sugar, 2 cups of sifted flour, 5 eggs, 1/2 cup cold water, 2 teaspoonfuls baking powder. Beat the yolks of the egg with the sugar, add the cold water, then the flour mixed with the baking powder then the well-beaten whites of 4 eggs and a pinch of salt; lastly, the juice and grated rind of 1 lemon. Bake in 4 ally cake tins.

From the North Sydney Herald we learn that business is quite brisk in Cape Breton this season. The boot and shoe factory at North Sydney is working night and day, though this can scarcely be called the busy season in the boot and shoe line. Work has not been so rushing on the Marine Railway for some years, as it is this season. The coal mines are increasing their output. The St. John, N. B. barque "Sea Crest" is being loaded at Glace Bay Mines with one thousand tons of coal for the Ottawa Gas Company, another practical proof that the demand for Nova Scotia coal in the Upper Provinces is not small and will be a most important factor in aiding the return of prosperity to the mining districts. The crops are looking well, the grass crop particularly.
