End Of M. C. A. Continental Conference  
ORILLIA, Ont. (CP) — More than 200 delegates to the YMCA's first continental young adult conference Saturday wound up their sessions with the passing of four resolutions concerning international policy and racial segregation.

Delegates to the week-long meeting were drawn from most parts of Canada and the United States with guests from India, Pakistan, the Gold Coast, Jamaica and Japan. Resolutions recommended that the YMCA's national councils in Canada and the U. S. seek and retain more young adult members for board of directors membership; provide frequent rotation of directors; jointly sponsor young adult programs on racial segregation and "that every YMCA initiate such a program within the same period of time."

Best Fiddler  
SHELBURNE, Ont. (CP) — Ned Landry, 33, of Saint John, N.B., Saturday night won the sixth annual Canadian fiddling contest in competition of eight finalists selected from 80 entrants. A professional fiddler, Landry was followed by Nick Wronanik, 35, a St. Catharines barber. Wayne (Sleepy) Marlin, of Louisville, Ky., and a former Canadian and United States champion, was third.

Marlin was first in the novelty competition. Second was Derald (Boots) Wetherby, a former Nova Scotia fiddler now living in Scotland. On Lee Hough, 25, of Streetsville placed third in the contest. Along with the winners' laurels went a cash prize of \$300. The contest was sponsored by the local Rotary Club.

Record Financing  
MONTREAL (CP) — More than 99 per cent of the Bell Telephone Co. of Canada's offering of 1,714,301 shares of \$25 par value stock at \$37 a share to shareholders of record June 7, has been taken up, the company disclosed Wednesday.

Subscriptions for more than 1,700,000 shares were received during the offering that closed July 27, bringing the company approximately \$63,000,000 in additional capital. Largest offering of its kind ever made to Canadian investors, the issue set a record in permanent financing by a Canadian company, Bell officials said.

Emery, 72, retired superintendent of communications for the Canadian Pacific Telegraphs' Quebec district, died in hospital here Saturday after an illness of several months. Another son and three brothers have been associated with the C.P.T., representing a total of more than 200 years in family service with the company. Mr. Emery, born in Saint John, began his career as an operator at Fredericton.

Montreal Stocks  
MONTREAL (CP) — Industrial losses ranged to three points or more at the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges closed substantially lower Monday in moderate trading.  
Base metals were hardest hit by the downward surge as Aluminum fell 4 1/2 points, Hudson Bay dropped 3 1/2 and International Nickel slipped 2 1/2. A point lost 3/4 while Steep Rock dropped 1 1/2 in the steels.  
Refining oils were fractionally softer as Imperial and B.A. eased 1/2. In the pipe lines Interprovincial slipped 1/4 while Trans Mountain improved a point. B.C. Power retreated 1/4 and Shawinigan eased 1/2 in the utilities.  
Powell River dropped 1 1/2 to lead the papers lower. Royal faded 1/2 in the banks. In the construction issues Canada Cement was off 1/2 and Dominion Bridge was down 1/2. General Dynamics and Dominion Glass were two-points lower in miscellaneous trade.  
Mines and western oils were mixed in a 15 cent range with Anthonian, El Pen Rey, Pathfinder, Portage and Quebec Smelting up. Del Rio, Cleveland Copper, Chib Jactuel and Gaspe were down. In the seniors Pacific Petroleum, Steep Rock and Opemiska Copper were off in a point range. The stock exchanges closing averages show banks off 0.16 at 59.70, utilities off 1.4 at 146.7, industrials off 2.8 at 329.8, combined off 2.4 at 268.3, papers off 20.74 at 1691.50 and goods off 0.42 at 85.28.

N. Y. STOCKS  
NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market took its worst drop Monday since June 8 on news of mounting tensions between Britain and Egypt over the Suez Canal seizure.  
The decline began in early trading with substantial losses for oil shares with big Middle East interests. All sections of the market followed in a broad shift to lower levels.  
The heaviest losses were registered by Royal Dutch and Gulf Oil. Royal Dutch, the most active issue of the day, declined 6 1/2 points to close at 100 1/4. Gulf Oil, second most active stock, went down 8 1/2 to 127 1/2.  
The decline represented an estimated loss of approximately \$2,500,000,000 in the quoted value of stocks listed on the New York exchange.  
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined \$2.10 to \$188.80.  
This was the biggest average drop since the loss of \$3 on June 8 when news of President Eisenhower's intestinal illness shook the market.  
U.S. Steel which went down 1 1/4 at 64 1/4 in heavy trading due to a report that the company was planning to close its plant in the decline. Aluminum Ltd. was down 3/4, a 1 1/2% drop. Kennecott Copper declined 2 1/2 to 137.

Among Canadian issues Hudson Bay Mining and International Nickel both lost 2 1/2 points. McIntyre Porcupine and Walker-Gooderham were down a point apiece and Canadian Pacific and Distillers-Seagrams were down 1/2. On the American stock exchange Shawinigan was down 3/4 and Brazilian Traction and Canadian Marconi 1/2.
