IN THE MATTER of the application of JOHN LEFURGEY respecting a Judgment formerly entered up in this Court, wherein the said John LeFurgy is plaintiff, and JAMES CRASWELL, now deceased, was defendant.

WHEREAS application hath been made to this Court on affidavit on the part of the said John LeFurgy stating the sum of One hundred and sixty-eight pounds eighteen shillings is due to him, on and secured by a certain Judgment of Record of this Court, at his suit against the said James Craswell, since deceased, entered up of Trinity Term, in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of her present Majesty Queen Victoria, and in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, for the sum of three hundred and twenty pounds debt, and three pounds costs of suit—and execution on such Judgment hath been moved for on behalf of the said John LeFurgy, as aforesaid.
