Production And Selection Are Stressed At Ayrshire Meeting

"The Prince Edward Island Ayrshire breeder can make a good living if he concentrates on production and makes a careful selection of his breeding stock," said Col. F.I. Andrew, national president of the Canadian Ayrshire Breeders' Association speaking at the annual meeting of the P.E.I. Ayrshire Breeders' Association yesterday. The retiring president, Gavin Reid of Montague, presided.

Mr. R.C. Parent was elected president of the Association and Arthur MacRae was named vice-president. Directors named for the coming year are Gavin Reid, Wallace Wood, Andrew MacRae, Douglas MacDonald, Edward Boswell. The secretary is Mrs. James Baldwin, Charlottetown.

R.O.P. TESTING
Col. Andrew stressed the importance of having cows on R.O.P. He felt that by culling out the undesirable animals from the herd the standard of the breed could be greatly improved in the Province.

The national president said dairy breeders in the provinces of Quebec and Ontario were more favorably situated than in Prince Edward Island. They were nearer the larger outlet for their milk sales. Col. Andrew reported that

P. E. I. Temperance Federation Wants Educational Director

The Executive of the P.E.I. Temperance Federation are taking steps to secure the services of a director of Temperance Education for the schools of the island. Initial steps were taken at a meeting of the executive held in the parlor of Hertz Hall Thursday under the chairmanship of Ralph MacCaul of Carleton, president of the Federation.

CALF BONUS
A change was made in the calf bonus program. From henceforth instead of being paid a flat rate per animal the bonus will be \$10 of the purchase price when the calf was from an R.O.P. dam, and \$3 where the dam is not qualified. The total bonus is not to exceed \$32 on any one animal.

Mr. Keith Clay, director of 4-H Club work in the Province favored the system of having a sliding scale. He felt that the flat rate was unfair to club members who purchased superior calves.

Mr. L.W. Roper, Federal Livestock Fieldman said that more care should be taken in seeing where the calves were placed. He did not favor the indiscriminate granting of the bonus because in some instances the animals were not properly cared for. Jim Nicholson of the staff of the Experimental Farm gave a very interesting and instructive talk on breeding and feeding experiments carried out at the Farm.

CONGRATULATE BREEDERS
The president, Gavin Reid in his annual report congratulated the various breeders who made good showings at the Provincial The Maritime and The Royal shows. He made particular mention of the herd of A. MacRae and Son who had the top female and the third bull in the Sale of Stars at the Royal Winter Fair.

Major MacRae stressed the need of a larger exhibit of the breed at the Amherst Fair. He recalled that some three or four years ago the island had a much larger representation at the Amherst Fair and were able to take a very creditable share of the prize money.

Activity On The Waterfront

Activity on the waterfront increased this week with the threat of the winter freeze-up getting nearer every day. The M.V. Ferguson, which arrived at the Railway Wharf earlier in the week, completed loading her cargo of general produce for Newfoundland points.

Lying at anchor in the harbor, was the Gulp Port, awaiting a berth at the Railway wharf. She was expected to dock late last night and will commence loading a cargo of 30,000 bags of potatoes from Canada Packers today. Load operations are expected to take three or four days. She will deliver the potatoes to Norfolk, Virginia.

The Imperial Oil tanker, Imperial Sarnia, also arrived in port early yesterday with some 34,000 barrels of mixed fuel from Halifax. She also was expected to leave late last night. Another Imperial tanker, The Imperial Halifax, is expected to arrive from the Nova Scotia capital today. It was learned from Company officials yesterday. She is carrying a mixed fuel cargo for Imperial's plant on Grafton Street East.
