'Power Of Uplifted Christ' Is Evangelist's Pulpit Topic

"The power of the Uplifted Christ" was the pulpit theme discussed by Dr. Charles P. Herndon, minister of Central Christian Church, at that congregation's evangelistic service last night.

Dr. Herndon stated that an awesome awareness of power (the result of nuclear research and experimentation - space exploration, etc.) is a salient aspect of contemporary civilization. The terrifying nature of uncontrolled power was noted by the speaker who asserted that the prevention of power by unbelievers and the despoilation of the same by a tethargic church were the terror and the tragedy of this era.

The church, the evangelist maintained has lost power through rearing of standards other than Christ whose power alone is the hope of his people! The power (authority) of Christ included that a reason, control of nature, death diabolical personalities, the ability to forgive sins, grant right to become sons of God through faith and to give eternal life.

Christ channelled all his authority and power into the cause of Christian evangelism through the great commission he declared. Since the uplifted Christ possesses such power and authority he should be elevated by His servants who must present him, a she Messiah, Creator, Saviour, Prophet, Priest, Judge, King, especially should Christ be lifted up in the church which he built, which is his body and of which He is the Head, Foundation and Cornerstone, the speaker concluded.
