

New singing star, Robin Moir, to highlight Fallfest

One of the most exciting of Canada's new, young recording artists, Robin Moir, will be appearing in a special cabaret performance for the UPEI Fallfest, at the UPEI gym, Wednesday, Oct. 13 at 9 p.m., with bar service.

Miss Moir soared to prominence late last fall with the release of her first single, You Can Do Magic, which resulted in her being nominated this year for a Juno award as best new female vocalist artist in Canada.

Following on the heels of that success, her second single, a beautiful ballad called All I Ask, received strong national radio play which was particularly satisfying for Miss Moir since it was her own composition.

The tempo of her career development has accelerated even more over the past few months. Her summer release Taking It All In Stride, was named pick-of-the-week by two different Canadian music trade magazines, RPM and Record Week. Her current single, In My Dreams I Was Never In Omaha, released

only Sept. 15, is already scoring heavily all across the country.

In addition to her singles, Robin has recorded her first album, which is scheduled for release early in November; and she has put together a dynamic concert show with a superb group of musicians. This is the show she is bringing to the Maritimes.

Although she has been compared to many of today's great performers--Rita Coolidge, Olivia Newton-John, Carole King, Roberta Flack--Robin Moir is in fact uniquely herself.

Because Robin is a fine songwriter as well as an exceptional vocalist she is able to maintain a versatility many other performers would envy. And because her remarkable voice responds perfectly to any demand she chooses to place on it, she is able to move uncannily from beautiful, emotional ballads to pop tunes to light rock with ease.

It is this very versatility that brings her such a wide audience. Because she is a contemporary recording artist

and includes many of today's hits by other artists as well as her own in her repertoire, she has found wide, enthusiastic response among young people. But equally, because of her innate musicality and appreciation of a good lyric she has acquired a devoted following of older people, many of whom admit discovering for the first time the musical and entertainment value of the songs of the 70's.

Like most other entertainers who find apparent "over-night success," Robin has worked for every break she's had. First there were years of musical training, then theatrical studies at the Lee Strasburg School in New York. That was followed by a series of appearances in local coffee houses, which gradually grew to a regular stint on the club and lounge circuit. As her following grew she found more opportunities opening to her. First some radio and television appearances, and then a contract with a music publisher and last year a recording contract with Quality Records through the Rubber Bullet label.

A native of Tillsonburg, Ont., Robin has recently moved to Toronto from Ottawa where she spent most of her life. She is also no stranger to the Maritime Provinces, being a frequent visitor on vacations as well as in pursuit of her career. Fiddlehead Records Ltd., based in Halifax with a branch office in Toronto, is both her management and her music publisher. In fact, Robin has another interest in the Maritimes, finding the area a particularly creative atmosphere. Many of her own compositions have been inspired by visits here.

Her concert show is a smooth, fast-paced, magical musical trip through pop, rock,

light country and beautiful ballad styles. It is a powerful, yet delightful presentation of one of Canada's most promising new stars.


