## Foreign-Controlled Firms Show Increase In Canada

**OTTAWA (CP)** - A sharp increase in the number of foreign-controlled industries in Canada has been reported by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics following a survey to 1960.

The bureau's publication, Canadian Statistical Review, reports that between 1953 and 1960 foreign - controlled companies valued at \$25,000,000 or more in the fields of manufacturing, petroleum, natural gas and mining increased to 143 from 98. In the same period Canadian-controlled firms in the same category increased to 51 from 40.

The United States controlled 51.7 per cent of these industries in 1960 compared with 48.8 per cent in 1953, and Britain controlled 9.8 per cent in 1960 compared with 4.8 per cent in 1953. Canadian control in 1960 dropped to 38.7 per cent from 46.5 per cent in 1953.

In the field of manufacturing, the United States investment in Canadian firms in 1960 totalled \$2,515,000,000, for 42.5 per cent of the total. Although this marked a sharp dollar increase from the 1953 figure of \$1,634,000,000, the percentage figure dropped from 47.4.

The Canadian percentage figure dropped further in the same period, to 39.3 from 45.6, while the country's dollar investment

## Bilingualism Problem Stressed By CEA Head

**EDMONTON (CP)** - Joseph Page, president of the Canadian Education Association, said here the problem of bilingualism is one that demands the attention of every national organization concerned with education.

"There is perhaps no aspect of Canadian education that now stands in greater need of systematic and co-operative study at the inter-provincial level," he said.

Before an acceptable program of instruction can be drawn up, we have to know how much bilingualism is desirable and practicable, and who should be encouraged or required to become bilingual.

To create a true spirit of bilingualism in Canada, he said, minorities wherever they live - French outside Quebec or English in Quebec - must have the right to teach their children in their native tongue.

"If this measure of linguistic reciprocity can be assured, I am willing, whatever else may be lacking, to regard Canada as essentially a bilingual country."

"Without this, for these Cana-

adians who are most directly concerned, bilingualism is a sterile and deceptive concept and we might as well abandon any large-scale efforts to promote it."

Text of his speech was released to the press prior to delivery.

Although hardly satisfactory, Mr. Page said, the present situation has "some encouraging aspects."

"Canada has gone rather far along the road to bilingualism than the census statistics, taken at their face
