Dow Brewery Will Destroy Beer From Plant In Quebec

MONTREAL (CP)—The Dow Brewery Ltd. said Wednesday it is withdrawing and destroying all its beer produced in Quebec City (and presently in the hands of agents and licensees). The company said in a statement that "in recent weeks hospitals in Quebec City have recorded a number of unusual cases of cardiac illness."

"The first reports indicated that there might be a link between these cases and an excessive consumption of beer produced in our Quebec City plant."

"But the investigation conducted by federal and provincial government authorities and by leading independent consultants has revealed no ingredient in the beer itself or any manufacturing process to which such cases might be attributed."

"However, shipments of Montreal-made beer will begin only when all beer produced in Quebec City presently in the hands of agents and licensees has been withdrawn from the market by our company and destroyed."

"Production in the Quebec City brewery has been ordered stopped by the company, the statement said, and all beer in the plant will be destroyed."

"The company said it now appears that the cardiac illness must be attributed to some other factor or combination of factors than any excessive consumption of its Quebec City-produced beer. The cause is 'as yet unknown.'"

"The investigation to ascertain this or these factors is proceeding as quickly as possible but may take several weeks."

"We have also been advised by the federal and provincial

government authorities that a careful investigation has revealed no cases of this type of illness in the area served by our Montreal brewery."

It was in the light of all these facts, said Dow, that the withdrawal and destruction of the Quebec City beer was ordered.

"Consumers in the area served by our Quebec City brewery having our products in their possession are urged to return them to their licensee who will refund the purchase price."

"The destruction of the beer in the brewery and of the beer withdrawn from the market will be carried out under government supervision and the public will be advised when the operation has been completed."

Dow said that on Wednesday it has informed government authorities in Ottawa and Quebec City of its decision, which it said was taken Tuesday night.

Effect Of Tax Change Shown In New Tables

OTTAWA (CP)—The full effect of Finance Minister Sharp's income tax changes, announced Tuesday night in his budget speech, will not be felt by most taxpayers when they make up their returns next spring for the 1966 taxation year.

It will only be felt if he changed rate prevails for a full 12 months from June 1, this year, when they go into effect. Another budget probably will be presented before June, 1967, which may include further changes in the income tax rate.

The following tables show federal taxes which will be payable for the calendar year, taxes which would be payable if the new rates were in effect for a full year, and taxes payable if no change had been made by Mr. Sharp.

The federal tax payable does not include provincial income tax or old age security tax, but includes an abatement of 24 per cent in accordance with current federal-provincial arrangements. It assumes the taxpayer takes the standard \$100 deduction for charitable donations.

The following table shows in order of columns, income, tax payable for 1966, tax payable in a full year and tax paid before the change.

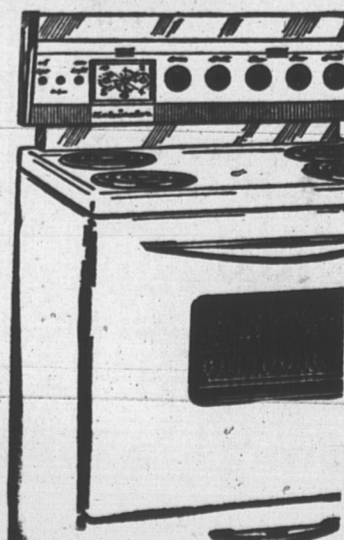

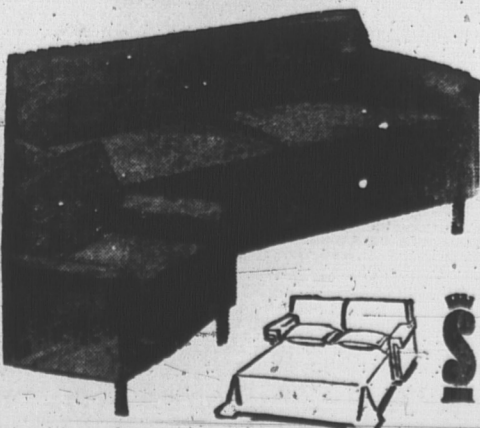
