

IT'S MINOR HOCKEY WEEK!

Jack Kane's fighting crew of red and white St. John's legionaries yesterday battled to a 5-5 win over Nova Scotia Technical College in a wide open game at the college rink.

ARCADIA, Calif. (AP) - The Crimson Satan, noted for his anti-social ways, performed in a mannerly fashion Saturday in the Stakes at Santa Anita Park here.

The odds-on-favorite with a crowd of 11 made a lead of 20.00. The Crimson Satan romped in by more than five lengths to capture the \$25,000 top prize in the inaugural running of the stakes.
