WALTER S. FOUNDED "In the midst of life we are in death" was exemplified in the sudden death of Walter S. Foun of Merced California aged 79 years at Forboro Mass on July 27th. The patronage and promotion of harness racing was his predominant passion. The two-column article and photo in The Harness Horse of Harrisburgh, Pa., July 29th, (inst), is testimony to the respect in which he was held by the racing fraternity of the United States. He started his active life, career by attending Bowdoin's Road (New London), thence to P.C. College, taught school at Clinton, P.E.I. became

a bank clerk at Charlottetown, where he first became interested in Racing. He returned to P.E. Island 1913-1916, and formed and promoted racing successfully at Clifton. He next moved to a lumber business in Haigler Nebraska and from there to an eminently successful lumber and farming business in Miracid California prominent among his racing productions at the Merced ranch were Patrick Primrose, Ruth F. and Miss Matern, His Hawkins Hoss won several lucrative races at Forbard Mass, Bay Meadows and Santa Anita Calif to his brother Harlan and nephews, Dr. Eric and Audrey, the sympathy of all friends and acquaintances is extended. They will long cherish the memory of a modest and unassuming soul whose demeanor, and attainments qualified him to "Sup with Kings yet not lose the common touch".

RADIO SALES INCREASE
 OTTAWA (CP) — A sharp increase in Canadian sales of radio receiving sets during the first half of 1959 was reported Tuesday by the bureau of statistics. Sales totalled 342,362 units including both home and auto sets — a 17.5-per-cent increase from the 291,391 units in the corresponding period last year. There was a rise of 2.6 per cent in sales of television sets, to 365,400 units from 361,179.

HOUSING EASING OFF
 OTTAWA (CP) — The housing boom showed signs of tapering off in Canada during the first four months of the year as the number of new dwellings started slipped from heights of a year earlier. In the four-month period starts in centres of 5,000 population or more declined to 2,764 units from 26,229 a year earlier. In April starts dropped 2,814 from 11,613.

Farm Windmill Is Rarer Sight
 The windmill in its North American manifestation is no thing of beauty. A bare, square steel skeleton carries a galvanized iron wheel, and a rod works up and down to pump water, in the usual form of this machine. A windmill in full working order is on its way to becoming a rare sight, although there are plenty of the abandoned towers scattered around. The windmill still is a reasonably convenient way to get power. The gasoline engine and the electric motor are more convenient and always ready to work. Their advantages outweighed the cheapness of wind power. Convenience and dependability were the wind's difference, so when the old windmills wore out they were not replaced.
