The Election!

PROVINCES HEARD FROM

Government Majority 25 to 30.

ONTARIO.

TORONTO, March 5. In Hamilton McKay and Ryckman (govt) are elected. In Waterloo, North, Bowman (opp.) is elected by 100 majority. In South Brant Patterson is elected; majority about 400. In West Bruce Morrison (govt) is elected by a majority of 32. In South Wellington Innis (opp.) is elected. In Lambton (west) Lyster (opp.) is elected by about 600 majority. In Oxford, North, Sutherland (opp) is elected by 200 majority. Montreal East returns Lapine (govt.) Montreal West, Sir Donald Smith (govt.) 249 majority. In Brockville, Wood (govt) is elected by about 220 majority. In Toronto Centre, Cookburn (govt) is elected by a majority of 544. In London Hyman (opp) is elected by a majority of 283. In Lennox Allison (opp) is elected. In Peel Featherstone (opp.) is elected by a majority of 102, with one place to hear from. In Ottawa City McInosh and Robillard (govt) are elected. In Middlesex (west) Hoome (Govt) is elected. In Peterboro (east) Burnham (Govt) is elected. In Victoria (south) Fairbairn (Govt) is elected. In Lunenburg (north) Jamieson (Govt) is elected. In York (west) Wallace (Govt) is elected. In Frontenac Kirkpatrick (Govt) is elected. In Grey (east) Sprunt (Govt) is elected. In Cardwell White (Govt) is elected.

QUEBEC.

QUEBEC, March 5. Sir Hector Languevin has been elected for Richelieu by a majority of 193. In Beauharnois Bergeron (Govt) is elected by a majority of 337, with one place to hear from. Conservatives were elected in Joliette, Maskinonge, Laprairie, Missisquoi, Hochelaga and Montcalm. In this Province the Government have elected D. or, Pope, Jones, Oulmet, Therien, Three in Montreal, Cleveland, Ives, Grandin, Chapleau, Languevin, (two seats) Daoust, Desautels, Frechette, Carignan. The Opposition have elected Beausoliel, Fauvil, Proulx, Simard, Lavergne, Choquette. Three in Quebec. Ryder, Mignault, Richard, Rodeur, Gauthier.

NOVA SCOTIA.

HALIFAX, March 5. In Antigonish Sir John Thompson is elected by a majority of 250. In Cape Breton County (Cape Breton) McKenna and McDougall (Govt) have a majority of three hundred. In Yarmouth, Flint (Opp.) is elected. Halifax (City) gives Kenny and Stairs (Govt) 759 majority. In Cumberland, Dickie (Govt) is elected. In King's, Borden (Opp) is elected by 200 majority. In Victoria, Cape Breton, Macdougall (Govt) leads the poll.

NEW BRUNSWICK. (THE BANNER PROVINCE.)

St. JOHN, March 5. In St. John city McLeod (Govt) has 2,220 votes; Ellis (Opp) 1,834 votes. All the returns for the city are in. St. JOHN, March 5. In St. John City and County three Conservatives are elected with large majorities. In Albert, Dr. Weldon (govt) is leading. In Charlotte, Guilmore (opp.) is leading. In Gloucester, Burns (govt) is elected. In Kent, L. Blance (opp.) is leading. In Northumberland, Adams (govt) elected by 500 majority over the Hon. Peter Mitchell. In Restigouche, McAllister (govt) is probably elected. In Sanbury, Wilnot (govt) leading. In Victoria, Costigan (govt) leading. In Westmorland, Wood (govt) elected by 1000 majority. In York Temple is leading by 260 majority. In Carleton, Vincent (govt) is leading, but his election is doubtful.

Manitoba and the North-West.

WINNIPEG, March 5. In Assinabois (East) Dowdney is elected by over 300 majority with several places to hear from. In Saskatchewan, MacDougall (Grit) is elected by a large majority. In Assinabois (West) Davin (Govt.) is elected by a large majority. In Lisgar, Ross (Cons.) elected by a majority of 250. In Winnipeg, Macdougall (Cons) is elected by a large majority.

LATEST.

OTTAWA, March 6. Advice to midnight give 115 Conserva-

tives to 82 Liberals, with 18 places to hear from,—a majority of 33. Ontario gives a liberal majority of 9, with three places to hear from. LAKE—The latest report gives 117 Conservatives and 89 liberals, with 9 counties to hear from. Returns from many places are incomplete. Languevin is elected in both Richelieu and Three Rivers by 300 and 200 majority. Caron is elected for Rimouski.

St. JOHN, Mar. 6—5 a. m. Foster is probably elected, though his majority will be small. Bard (Govt) is also probably elected in Queen's County. If this be so, New Brunswick has returned 14 Conservatives and 2 Liberals.

MONTREAL, March 6, 5 1/2 a. m. The Government is sustained by at least twenty five majority.

WASHINGTON WHEAT CROP.—A recent despatch from Tacoma says: The prospects for the Washington wheat crop of 1891 have been brightened very considerably by the heavy fall of snow east of the mountains during the past week. The crop of the Northwest for 1890 was sixteen million bushels, twelve of which were for export. The wheat acreage in Washington this year will be 15 per cent greater than that of 1890, which will produce a crop of eighteen million or nineteen million bushels.

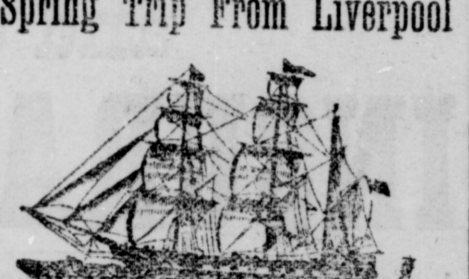

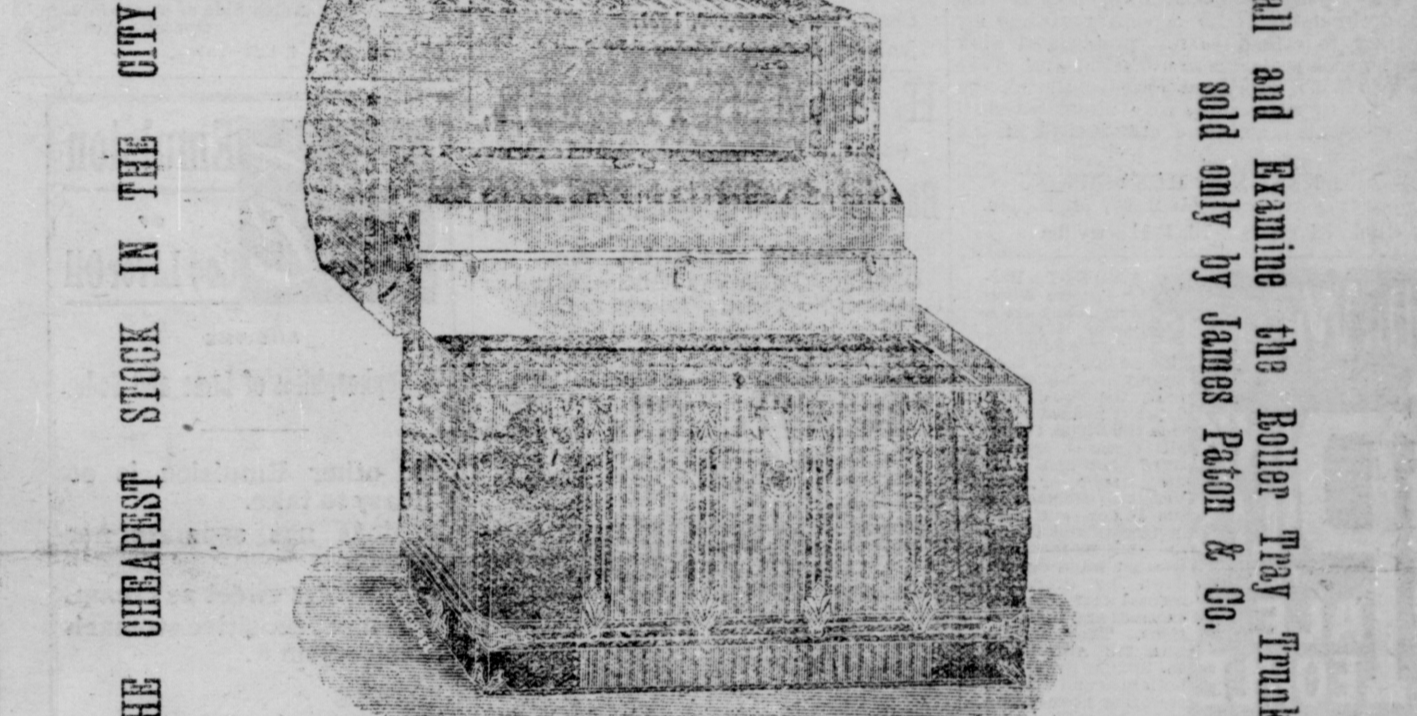
