*I have thought fit by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Executive Council, further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued until THURSDAY, the Third day of MARCH next ensuing, then to meet for the DESPATCH OF BUSINESS, of which all persons concerned, are required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.*

*Given under my hand and the Great Seal of this Island, at Charlottetown, in the said Island, this Third day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and in the thirty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.*
