Special Dispatch to the Examiner. DUBLIN, Oct. 26.

The Constabulary have been instructed to warn persons against allowing Land League meetings in their houses. Every person attempting to hold League meetings will be immediately arrested.

Mr. Gladstone has arrived at Knowsley, and will receive a deputation on Thursday. Special precautions for his safety have been taken during the journey, and his movements are kept secret.

First Assistant Postmaster General Tynor has sent in his resignation to the President. It has been accepted.

Wm. Windom, late Secretary of the Treasury, was to-day formally elected United States Senator.

The followers of Maori Chief of the Whites, have assumed the aggressive attitude towards the British.

The Emperor and Empress of Brazil will arrive in Europe shortly.

Two of the Circassians who robbed and maltreated Mr. Pierce, the American Missionary, have been tried and sentenced to five years' penal servitude.

The Liberal candidate from Berwick was returned to-day, receiving 1,046 votes against 529, for Fritton, Conservative.

In the Criminal Court, the counsel for Guiteau made an application for the postponement of his trial and, after hearing the arguments, the Court stated he would postpone the trial from Nov. 7th to Nov. 17th.

The river is still rising. It is now about four inches above high water mark of June.

Lazier, who killed D. S. Love, here, last Friday, was examined before Judge Valliant, Mayor of Greenville, yesterday, and acquitted. The Mayor is one of our most highly respected citizens, and his decision is endorsed by the entire community.

The details of the libel by Love on the wife of Lazier, for which the latter followed Love a long distance and finally shot him on sight, are utterly unfit for publication.

Early this morning a fire destroyed the building in Woonsocket owned by the American-Worsted Co. The printing press works owned by Geo. W. Miller, were destroyed, with the office of the "Daily Reporter and Patriot." Total loss, \$125,000; insured for \$114,000.
