This is to bring to your attention a complaint concerning the services provided in Dalton Hall.

As of this year we, the residents of Dalton Hall are expected to present our bedding to the laundry adjacent of the Heating Plant for exchange. In the past this exchange of bedding was always carried out in the building.

This is but another illustration of a history of residence fee increase accompanies by a decrease in service. This also furthers the gap between the service and housing provided to female residents as compared to male residents.

It is my feeling that this situation has gone on too long and therefor it is time that everything possible should be done to rectify this problem in the immediate future. The following recommendations would be recognized as a sign of good faith on the part of male residents.

- 1 Restoration of bedding pickup in the male residences
- 2 Installation of electric shaver outlets in washrooms.
- 3 Cleaning of floors in rooms at least twice monthly.
- 4 Glazed window in first floor washrooms.
- 5 Mirrors in each room.
- 6 Locks on toilet doors.
- 7 Broom in each room.

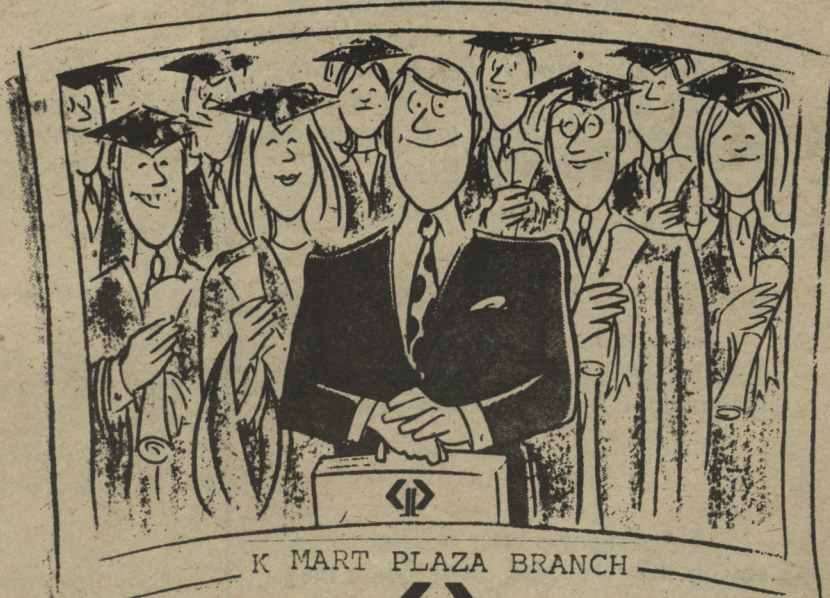
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
