MRS. GORDON MacMILLAN A COUNTRY GARDEN

October could not stay. Her flame was as a sacrificial fire. The flowers departed as they came. Now earth has donned her gray attire.

Oh foolish earth, that time moves on. It hardly worth a moment's tear. Already from the ashes spread Spring, anticipating dawn.

Spring gardens depend on the planting and planning at this time and when there does not seem much time these busy days, remember that many gardening tasks can be done in the next few weeks if the weather is half as fine as the past week has been.

Summer visitors looked at the many plants needing winter protection and wondered if they could be saved for another year. Little by little each day the task has been accomplished and speeded up this year by remembering the early winter of last year. Some years it is possible to leave this work until very late but working in the snow last year was not pleasant and we remember the old country saying that "all should be gathered in by Halloween."

NOT TOO DEEP It gives one a nice sense of satisfaction after a special effort to have this done and on stormy days the boxes and flats of bulbs and plants can be tidied and attended to in a leisurely manner. Bulbs should not be stored so deeply that air cannot circulate, and all through the season must be watched if they are needed in quantity next spring.

A dry, bright storage room is a blessing when storing many plants and bulbs but you can make the most of what you have if care is taken to elevate the storage receptacles so the drainage is perfect even if water does seep into the basement.

The tomatoes in the garden have been ripening since storing and this is because they were carefully sprayed throughout the summer with a good potato spray. I remember when placing tomatoes carefully in a tray so as not to bruise them; that one autumn I had tucked them away in an upstairs room in a drawer, and had forgotten them until one snowy day in December when they were a very pleasant surprise to see and certainly grand to eat in perfect condition.

Usually they are kept in baskets in a warm place until they begin to show color and then are moved to a cool room. If they are sorted over often and the spoiled fruit removed they will keep much better and often the seconds can be made into delicious preserves with lemons and ginger root, and we must not forget the fragrant, and spicy tomato chow when more of this fruit can be used. Wrapping them separately in paper is a good way to keep tomatoes for a long time. Select your very choicest fruit and you will be amazed and delighted to find how long they have kept in good condition.

COUNTRY HARVEST Country gardens yield a rich harvest at this time and it keeps the gardener very busy that none of this bounty is lost by frost or careless handling in storage. On days too wet for outdoor work this indoor storing must be done. The weather is watched more often in this season than in any other as the sun depends on the country.
