

# Eagles Topple Nats To Clinch 1st Place

SUMMERSIDE — RCAF Eagles handed Borden Nationals one of their worst beatings this season 10-2 yesterday to clinch first place in the Prince County Hockey League.

The contest, played at the Air Base, was the last league one for each team this season and prior to the match they both had 30 points.

# Red Wings Nip Leafs 3-2; New York Ties Canadiens

DETROIT (AP) — The Detroit Red Wings packed all their scoring into the second period Sunday night and then squeezed out a 3-2 victory over the Toronto Maple Leafs that moved them into a third-place National Hockey League tie with Toronto.

Bruce MacGregor, Alex Fonteyne and Alex Delvecchio tied the scoring for Detroit and Delvecchio's power play goal was his second winning goal in as many days. Delvecchio also connected on a power play Saturday in Detroit's 3-2 victory over New York.

Bob Pulford and George Armstrong scored for Toronto, which lost for only the second time in its last 10 starts as the Detroiters treated their largest crowd of the season, 14,582, to their eighth straight home-ice victory their longest string since 1955-56.

# Chicago Black Hawks Bomb Boston Bruins

Chicago (AP) — Chicago Black Hawks took a slightly firmer grip on the National Hockey League lead Sunday night by beating last-place Boston Bruins 7-0 in a wild, fight-filled battle.

Chicago's triumph, combined with second-place Montreal Canadiens' 2-2 tie with New York Rangers, boosted the Black Hawks' edge to three points.

Bobby Hull, Hawks' high-scoring left wing, sat out his second game in a row and his sixth in the Hawks' last eight because of stretched ligaments on both knees.

The Hawks also were without the services of rookie centre Fred Stanfield, who underwent an appendectomy early Sunday morning after becoming ill on the train coming from Saturday's game in Toronto.

FIGHT STARTED

A wild, stick-swinging brawl involving six players broke out midway in the last period. It began with Chicago's Doug Mohns and Boston's Orland Kurtenbach; who started slashing at each other. Boston's Ted Green and Stan Mikita of the Hawks tussled briefly and the go into a fight that lasted nearly a minute and a half.

Mohns, who came to Chicago last summer from the Bruins in a trade, and Kurtenbach, each drew five-minute penalties for deliberately attempting to injure, and were tossed out of the game.

Fleming and MacNeil were given five-minute majors, and Mikita and Green drew minors for roughing.

Mikita's, the league's leading scorer, led Chicago's attack and the fist of his career. Boston rookie Jack Norris kicked out 38 Chicago shots.
