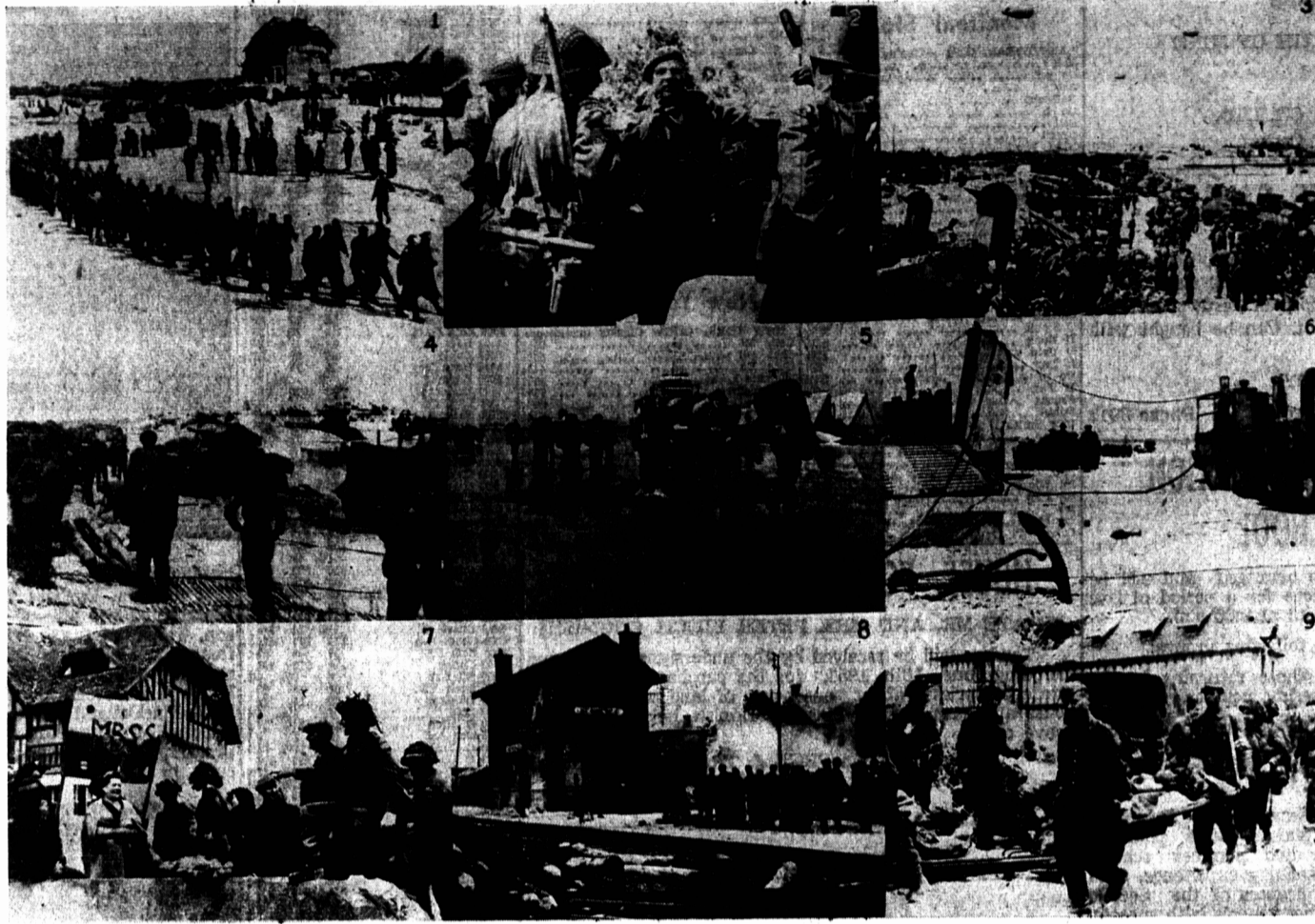

### Clarifies Views On Hypnotism

TORONTO, (CP)—Hypnotism should not be necessary, nor is it advisable, as a substitute for anaesthetics in dentistry, Dr. Donald S. Moore of Hamilton says.

Dr. Moore added that there are no harmful effects from the use of hypnosis by physicians and dentists who have studied the subject, but lay hypnotists or stage hypnotists have no place in treating medical or dental patients.

Dr. Moore, who said he does not use hypnosis in his own dental practice, expressed his views on hypnosis in commenting on press reports last month that he had demonstrated the use of hypnosis at a meeting in Toronto of the Ontario Dental Nurses' and Assistants' Association and for the faculty of dentistry at University of Toronto.
