## Greek Premier Is Assured Of Slim Majority In Parliament

ATHENS (AP)—Election returns Monday night kept Greece, at least for the present, on the path of cooperation with the West. Followers of Premier Constantine Karamanlis were assured of 156 seats in the new 300-seat Parliament. And they may wind up with a more decisive edge over an Opposition that ranges from Communist-liners to Nationalists of the far right. The seven-party Opposition coalition called the Democratic Union appeared assured of 137 seats.

## Injured Boy May Spend Rest Of Life In State Of Sleep

HAMILTON, Ont. (CP)—A 10 year old boy, injured last September in a car accident, may spend the rest of his life in a state of sleep. A board of doctors at Hamilton General Hospital informed Mrs. Myrtle Oates Sunday that they were convinced her son, Michael, will never regain consciousness. Mrs. Oates, her daughter Donna, 9, and Michael were injured when their car was struck broadside by another car Sept. 4. Mr. Oates, 31, was killed in the accident. Michael has been unconscious ever since the accident. He is fed through a gastric tube. His nurses say he cries frequently and bitterly but never makes a sound. The only time he has ever been heard to make a sound was two months after the accident when his mother, who suffered fractures to all of her ribs and her left arm, was brought into his room in a wheel chair to see him.
