Dedication Service Held In Ancient Kirk

EDINBURGH, (CP)—The glittering Honors of Scotland were carried in procession for the first time in 131 years Wednesday as the Queen rode in splendor through Edinburgh to the old gray kirk of St. Giles.

Ancient Symbols

The Honors of Scotland, symbols of ancient Scottish sovereignty, were last carried in procession in 1822 by George IV. They consist of a 35-pound crown repudely worn by King Robert the Bruce, a 430-year-old sword with a 39-inch blade, and a 18th century sceptre.
