In June, 1947, Dr. McLean was named medical examiner of the 4th district of Plymouth County, including the towns of Middleboro, Wareham, Mattapoisett, Carver, Rochester, Lakeville and Marion. The appointment was made by former Gov. Robert F. Bradford to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of the late Dr. A. Vincent Smith who had held the position for 21 years. Dr. McLean continued to serve in this capacity until his death.

In addition to his ever increasing demands as a general practitioner, Dr. McLean also devoted much time to the interests of Middleboro's St. Luke's Hospital, and had served varying terms as chief of staff of that institution and was presently serving as secretary to the staff.

He was a member of the Massachusetts Medical Association, the American Medical Association, the Massachusetts Medical Society, the American League and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Surviving are his wife, the former Lillian Grant; four sons, Douglas S., Wallace M., Stewart R. and Grant A., all of Middleboro; his mother, Mrs. Malcolm J. McLean of Plymouth; a brother, Donald C. McLean of Plymouth, and a sister, Mrs. Margaret Bent, also of Plymouth.

The death occurred at the P.E.I. Hospital on March 15, 1959 of Mrs. Charles Larter, Hampshire in her 59th year.

She was born in Quincy, Mass., the daughter of James and Mary Cummings, but on the death of her mother, she was adopted by Mr. and Mrs. George Johnson. At the age of sixteen she moved with her widowed foster mother to P.E.I. in 1919 she was united in marriage to Charles Larter of Hampshire who predeceased her in March 1950.

Left to mourn the loss of a devoted mother are her sons Heath and Leighton, also eleven grandchildren and three half-brothers namely, Daniel and John of Vernon River, Garfield of Lakeburn, N.B. and her half sister (Mary) Mrs. Stephen MacMillan, Charlottetown. A son Alec predeceased her in June 1958.

Her funeral which was very largely attended was held from her late residence on March 17th with Rev. Foster Hall officiating, assisted by Rev. Donald Nicholson who also sang a solo
