West Indian Farm Students Face Difficulty

GUELPH, Ont. (CP) — An Ontario Agricultural College official said Wednesday that West Indian students wanting to enter the college's practical farming diploma course this year must first spend three months working on an Ontario farm or its equivalent.

Dr. Norman High, director of the OAC practical farming course, said the regulation, introduced this fall, is designed to protect West Indian students.

In former years some have been miserable and dissatisfied with the course because they did not understand the nature of it, he said.

A West Indian farm is not considered by OAC to be comparable to an Ontario farm and immigration regulations forbid the students to work on farms here.

Did Good Job For Hungarians

Anglicans—immigrants BRANDON, Man. (CP)—A lay delegate to the executive council of the Anglican Church of Canada's annual meetings Thursday suggested that federal government officials, while doing "a great job for Hungarian immigrants, sometimes are a little too generous."

Judge J. Elliot Hudson of Halifax said meal allowances for refugees travelling on trains was \$6.75 a day—\$1.75 for breakfast, \$2.25 for lunch and \$2.75 for dinner.

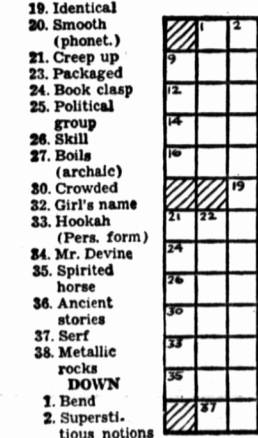
"I know some delegates to general synod take along a box lunch packed for them by their wives," he said.

His remarks were not audible in the subsequent uproar. (The \$3 he referred to is the allowance granted by general synod to travelling delegates to the meetings here.)

The Rt. Rev. T. A. Norris immediately said he hoped the council would not go "on record as in any way regretting that these people should be given a good meal."

"I hope we shall not in anyway cast a slur. The only slur we could cast is in our own finance board for not raising our allowance."

Again the delegates broke out in laughter. The exchange arose during debate of a report by the executive council on the social services boards work in the field by the general secretary of social services, Dr. L. F. Hatfield.

He said an immigrant arrived in Canada at the rate of "one every three minutes in 1952." In all about 164,000 were admitted. In 1957 the number has so far increased to 175,000, a 44-year high, and this is expected to reach 200,000 by the end of the year, he said.

"We have a responsibility as Christians to share this land with others less fortunate and we need people to help to develop our resources."

He added there was no reason for Canadians to "become sour" on policies of immigration. Dr. J. C. Flanagan of Montreal said Canadians appreciate the work of immigration officials but were against the use of immigrants as strike breakers, "as occurred at Murdochville, Que."
