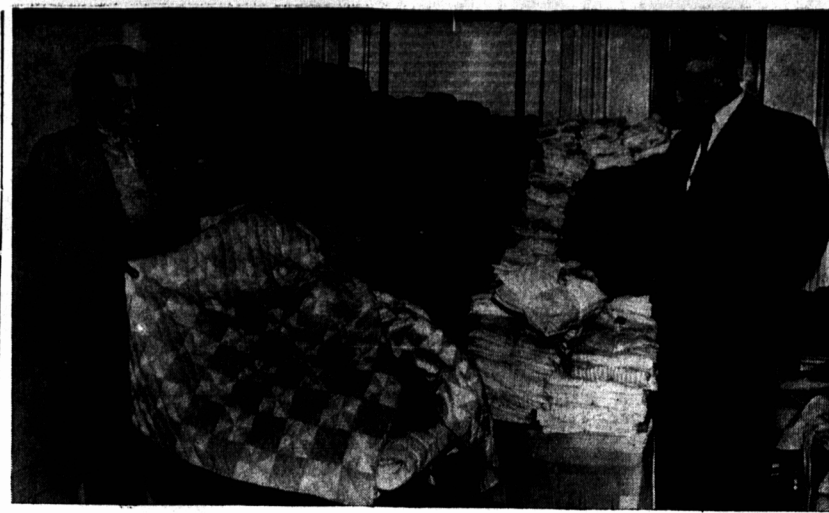

Awarded Nobel Prize In Medical Research

STOCKHOLM AP) — The 1955 Nobel prize in medicine was awarded today to Dr. Hugo Theorell, a Swedish biochemist, "for his discoveries concerning the nature and mode of action of oxidation enzymes."

He will receive a record Nobel cash award equal to \$36,720.85 along with the Nobel insignia from King Gustaf VI Adolf at ceremonies here Dec. 16. The money comes from a \$9,000,000 foundation established by the will of Alfred Nobel, inventor of dynamite.

HONG KONG (Reuters) — A Canadian missionary couple arrived here today after 30 years in China and praised the accomplishments of the Chinese Communist regime.

Mr. and Mrs. Homer G. Brown of the United Church of Canada said that under the Communist regime "we smelled no opium, saw no gambling, met no beggars." They said that if Communist China got "reasonable co-operation from and with all nations" she could look forward to a "leading place among the nations of the world."
