only 10 cents a tree, the man who puts it in his living room will still pay his shot. After the trees are bought from the chopper, trucks haul them to shipping points at an hourly rate of about \$2.50. Then tallymen, earning about \$7 a day, count them. They are then sorted and baled by workers earning anywhere from \$3 to \$18 a day, depending on production, and scraps are burned or hauled away by yard laborers who get about \$6 a day.
