NORMAN BISHOP Walter is also doing some breeding and is fortunate in having some excellent brood mares and we believe that several of the youngsters and some of those he is getting ready to race will take very fast records. He is also fortunate to have as his trainer-driver Clarence Hansen. He is a Bishop in the Mormon church and a man whom everyone respects and likes. In the No. 1 list of the Universal Driver Rating System and Chart for drivers having 200 and more starts in 1956, Driver Hansen is second to Joe O'Brien of Alberton. In 204 starts he had 52 firsts, 38 seconds and 15 thirds, with an average of 3:33.

The pacer Torpid, who earned \$73,736 last year as a 2-year-old, is the winter book favorite for The Little Brown Jug, also the Messenger Stake at Roosevelt and the W. H. Cane Stake at Yonkers. His chief rival is expected to be Adios Express, who is also listed in all three events. Henry Smokey's fine performance at the end of last season has made him the winter book favorite for the Hambletonian which will be raced at DuQuoin, Ill., this year for the first time. It will be worth about \$12,000.
