

# Viet Nam Position Draws Criticism

OTTAWA (CP) — The United States position on Viet Nam and to a lesser degree Canada's drew a mixture of support and criticism in the Commons Monday.

Social Credit leader Thompson strongly supported both governments and criticized those who found fault with U.S. military intervention and Canada's peace-making efforts in the Asian conflict.

It was the second day of debate on the Viet Nam war that began Friday during debate on interim supply of \$1,662,000,000 to carry the government through to the end of the fiscal year.

It was not the Americans who were criticizing the war in Viet Nam.

Nam said Mr. Thompson but the Communists by their constant increase in the number of enemy troops they were pouring into the fighting.

On the recent U.S. bombing of targets near Hanoi and Haiphong he said "all depots are legitimate enemy targets."

The argument that cessation of U.S. bombings would lead to negotiations was "unrelated to reality," he said.

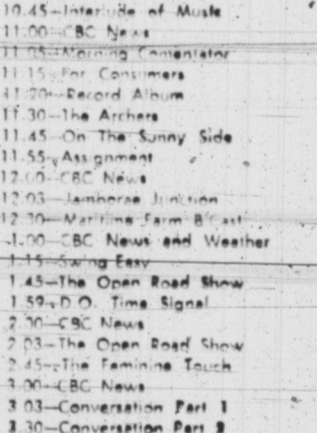

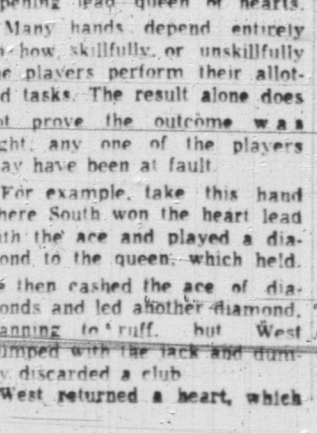

ST LOUIS, Mo. (AP) — City Coroner Mrs. Helen Taylor said Tuesday that at least 17 persons have died here since Sunday because of a heat wave blistering the U.S. mid-west with 100-degree temperatures.

She said the death estimate was made by Dr. John J. Thomas, pathologist for the coroner's office. St. Louis entered its fourth straight day of over 100-degree readings Tuesday.

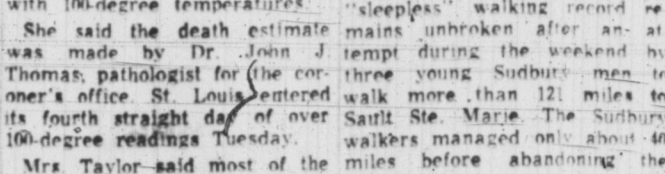
