CONTRACT BRIDGE

West dealer. Both sides vulnerable. NORTH: K87, A-K-J, Q-8-4, K-J-8-3. WEST: 2, 8-7, A-K-9-5-3, Q-9-7-4. EAST: 5-3, Q-10-9-5, J-7, A-10-6-5-2, 4-3-2. SOUTH: A-Q-J-10-9-6-4, 4-3-2, 10-6-7.

The bidding: West North East South Pass 1NT Pass 4

Opening lead—king of diamonds.

Players who like to dabble with squeeze cards can exercise their talents with this hand, where West cashes the A-K of diamonds and then gives East a ruff.

East returns a trump. How can South win the rest of the tricks, assuming the best defense by East-West? And just to make things easier, let's presume that the location of all the East-West cards is known to declarer.

The trouble with hands of this type usually is that when declarer runs his trumps he finds that dummy gets squeezed instead of the opponents. But sometimes the squeeze operates successfully even though dummy is squeezed out of a vital card.

To show what happens event-

ally, let's project the position that arises after South wins the trump return and cashes four more spades:

North: A-K-J, Q-10-9, 8-7-6-5-4-3-2. West: 8-7-6, 4-3-2. East: Q-10-9, 8-7-6-5-4-3-2. South: A-K-J, Q-10-9, 8-7-6-5-4-3-2.

Declarer leads a spade and West must discard. If West discards a heart, so does dummy. East cannot now spare a heart because declarer could then cash the A-K of hearts and claim the rest of the tricks. So East is forced, therefore, to discard the ten of clubs.

When East does this, South plays a heart to dummy, ruffs the jack of clubs, felling the ace, and that's all, brother. If West discards the nine of clubs, declarer again discards the jack of hearts. East's best discard now is a heart. But it avails him nought. Declarer simply leads a heart to the ace and plays the king of clubs. Once more, East is dead.

If East ducks, South discards. If East covers, the ace and king of clubs fall on the same trick as declarer ruffs, thus establishing dummy's jack.

There is no escape. The squeeze is absolutely remorseless. Bridge is an easy game.

Four Quints Have Party

MONTREAL (CP) — The four remaining Dionne quintts met briefly Thursday to celebrate their 25th birthday.

Cards and telegrams from all over the world have been pouring into Montreal to the quintts, now separated by marriage.

Philippe Langlois, TV technician and husband of Cecile, told reporters Thursday that his wife had arranged to meet her other sisters in Montreal for a small get-together and probably a lunch. They exchanged small gifts.

"We have had many many telegrams and messages from all over the world," he said. "But my wife has not heard from the Canadian government—but that is not unusual. Among our cards is one from Cecile's mother and father. They stay out of town."

Added Mr. Langlois: "There may be a private get-together later in the week as a result of today's meeting. I do not know yet. But I will be taking my wife out to celebrate privately."

The quintts have retreated largely from the world spotlight switched on them every marriage, birth and birthday. Their home telephones are not listed. Their parents, who live in Callander, Ont., told reporters "we cannot manage to get to Montreal for health reasons. But we have sent the quintts our gifts and cards."

Cecile and Marie are neighbors in a suburb here. Both are married. Cecile was the first of the quintts to have a child of her own. A son Claude was born last September.

Annette, now Mrs. Germain Alard, wife of a loan company executive, also has a son, Jean-Francois, born two months later. Yvonne, still single is a nurse. The fifth quint, Emilie, died at the age of 20 in a rest home north of the city.

The quintts can be silent in comfort. At the age of 21 each came into a \$250,000 trust fund.

Celebration Plans Are Taking Shape

QUEBEC (CP)—Plans for the September celebration of the bi-centennial anniversary of the Battle of the Plains of Abraham are taking shape, it was announced Wednesday.

Theme of the celebrations will be "two centuries of progressive partnership," Gabriel Pelletier, president of the St. Jean Baptiste Society of Quebec, told a press conference.

Gordon Ross, president of the St. Andrew's Society of Quebec, said the celebrations will be of national character. Premiers of all provinces would be invited.

The main ceremony would be held Sept. 13 at the Montcalm-Wolfe Monument near the Chateau Frontenac.

Generals Wolfe and Montcalm died Sept. 13, 1759, in the battle which resulted in the passing of what was then Canada from French to British rule.
