PASTOR RESIGNS.—It is learned with much regret that the Rev. R. Davidson of Lot 14 has resigned his charge after a pastorate of seven years, resignation to take effect on the last Sunday of June next. Having spent two years in the Normal College at Truro, N. S., Mr. Davidson taught in the public schools of that province for a few years and gained distinction as a teacher. He then entered Mt. Allison University from which he graduated in Arts. Thereafter he attended Princeton Seminary where he spent three years and graduated in theology. In addition to the regular work at Princeton, Mr. Davidson took extra curriculum work under the late Dr. B. B. POPULAR APPOINTMENT.—The Archbishop has appointed Mr. Alfred Holmes, M. A., a graduate of Toronto University and Wycliffe College in charge of Anglican services in Georgetown and Cherry Valley for the summer months. Mr. Holmes is an Irishman by birth, and has just completed his college course, which was interrupted by military service in the Great War. Enlisting as a private, he later obtained a commission with the "nd Royal Dublin Fusiliers. He was wounded and taken prisoner at Wytshaele Ridge, May 27th, 1917, and remained a prisoner till the armistice was signed.

Rev. Neil McNeil, Archbishop of Toronto. Mr. Trainor attended St. Dunstan's and Ottawa Universities and later completed his classical course at St. Michael's College, Toronto. He pursued his philosophical and Theological studies at St. Augustine's Seminary, Toronto, from which institution he is about to graduate. Father Trainor will celebrate his first Solemn Mass at St. Joseph's Church, Sudbury, Ontario, where his brother, Rev. Thomas H. Trainor, is pastor. Father Trainor, who is a brother of Mr. P. C. Trainor, Euston St., will have the warmest wishes of his friends here for a long and happy career in the Priestly ministry.

U. S. FREIGHT RATES LOWERED

WASHINGTON, May 25—A reduction of freight rates on the United States Railways, averaging about ten per cent was ordered today by the United States Commerce Commission in a decision resulting from its enquiry into the general rate and structure of the nation. One cut in freight rates was fixed by a commission of four per cent in the eastern territory. Thirteen, or one half per cent in western territory and twelve and one half per cent in the southern mountain Pacific territories. All reductions are ordered effective on July 1st and constitute a greater cut than was generally expected.

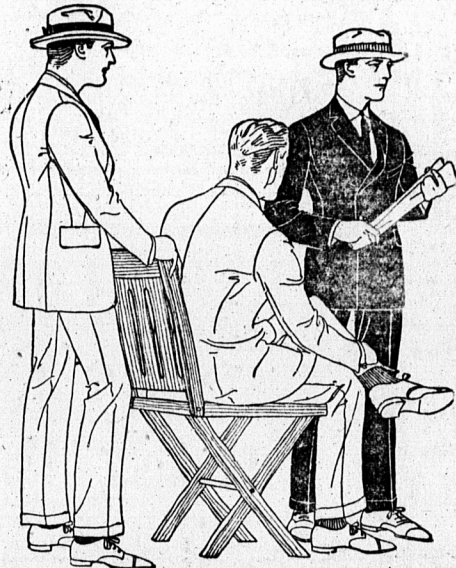
