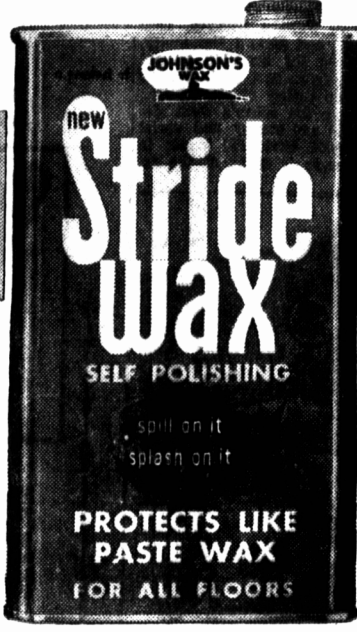
SIDEWINDER IN SERVICE
