

Green Bay Packers Place Ten On AP All-Star Team

NEW YORK (AP) — Green Bay Packers dominated the Associated Press all-star team of the National Football League with a total of 10 of the 22 players selected on the offensive and defensive units.

Paul Hornum, player of the Year in 1961, did not make the team selected by a committee of sports writers and broadcasters in the 14 league cities. Green Bay's star, halfback missed about half the season due to a knee injury.

Fullback Jim Taylor, tight end Ron Kramer, tackle Forrest Gregg, guard Jerry Kramer and center Jim Patton of the defending champion Packers were named to the first offensive team. Defensive end Willie Davis, tackle Henry Jordan, linebackers Dan Currie and Bill Forester and corner back Herb Adderley of the Packers made the defensive unit.

New York Giants, who already have clinched the Eastern Conference title, put four men on the two teams, including V. A. Tittle, their 26-year-old quarterback, and Del Sudds.

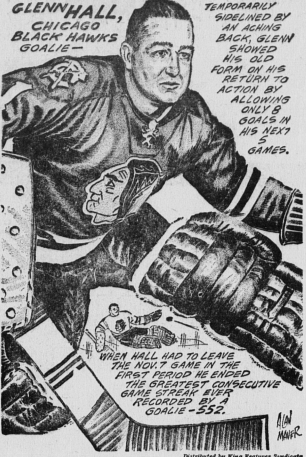

BOSTON (AP) — Ralph Terry's contribution to Detroit Tigers' Hank Aguirre was the most significant in the American League pennant race, reflected in the official 1962 pitching statistics released Tuesday.

The 26-year-old right-hander, taking up the slack caused by ace lefty Whitford Ford's arm injuries, was the most significant in the junior circuit (.23), pitched the most innings (299), and started the most games (29). He also allowed the most homers at 40.

Terry, who blanked San Francisco 1-0 in the seventh and deciding game of the World Series, finished eighth in the regular season earned run average competition with a 3.19 average.

Gump Worsley Returns Tonight

NEW YORK (AP) — Unbeaten Southern California has been voted the 1962 collegiate football champion in an Associated Press poll. It is the first west coast team to receive the honor since 1959.

The Southern California Trojans, who completed their perfect season by defeating Notre Dame 24-0 Dec. 1, polled 569 points to 429 for runner-up Wisconsin while drawing 42 of the possible 52 first-place votes.

The Trojans will meet Wisconsin in the Rose Bowl at Pasadena, Calif., on New Year's Day.

Five Players Loaned Blades

NEW YORK (AP) — Five players were loaned to New Haven Blades from other clubs in the Eastern Hockey League Tuesday under an emergency agreement arranged to protect a club in the event of a disaster.

The Blades' bus overturned near Sparta, Tenn., Sunday night while the New Haven team was travelling to Nashville for a game tonight. Fourteen players were injured, none seriously.

Only one, Fern Bernaquez, remained in hospital. He suffered head cuts and bruising of the neck and back. His condition was described as good.

League president Tom Clarkhart said Tuesday that under the disaster plan New Haven is entitled to draft enough players from other league clubs to round out its squad.

Players on loan to the Blades are George Gosselin of Clinton, Ken Coombes of Knoxville, Andy Vozar of Charlotte, Don Atmanchuk of Johnston and Harvey Turnbull of Greensboro.

An additional player may be loaned if New Haven is still short-handed.

Berry was an umpire in the International League in 1941 and 1942 when his contract was acquired by the American League.

He umpired in six World Series and five all-star games.
