FEEDING PIGS.

Professor Robertson declares in his valuable annual report that "it is impossible to raise swine successfully in large numbers without giving them skim-milk and batter milk, or a good run of clover pasture when the young pigs are growing. During the winter time a quantity of clover hay, cut, steamed and soaked for three hours, is an admirable addition to the feed of growing swine. Where pigs are put in pens and fed on grain only from the time they are weaned, a large proportion of them will become sick and go off their feet before they are fully fattened. Hogs should never be given more feed at one time than they will eat clean, and still have an appetite for more. Overfeeding keeps the hogs from being active in taking exercise; and that causes them to grow too fat and soft. It is a good plan to feed as much as they will consume and digest to advantage. That will keep them hungry for every meal. Experienced feeders claim that regularity in the time of feeding will cause more rapid gain in weight than when there is irregularity even to the extent of one hour in the meal time. The feed of swine should be reasonably clean. It should certainly never be in a putrid condition.
