PM Sees Danger In Huge U.S. Trade Deficit

By HAROLD MORRISON... MONTREAL (CP) - Prime Minister Diefenbaker said Thursday...

Canada's huge deficit in trade with the United States constitutes an "ultimate danger to this country."

He made the statement at a press conference at Dorval Airport where the 50-man Canadian trade mission gathered for its flight to Britain...

Mr. Diefenbaker, who arrived to say goodbye, told reporters Canada imports too much from the United States and sells her too little.

He said that why this mission to Britain—to seek diversion of Canada's imports from the U.S. to Britain—is so important.

"Canada's trade deficit, which is estimated at \$1,300,000,000 a year. If it continued, Canada would be in trouble — it would constitute an ultimate danger to this country."

He declined to go further than to say "This is an economic danger."

He said the mission, mostly Canadian industrialists, has possibly achieved "epoch-making advances" in trade with Britain.

He recalled that last July he expressed a hope that Canada might be able to divert 15 per cent of her imports from the U.S. to Britain. He believed a major part of this hope will be achieved.

In support of this, he mentioned that a Commonwealth trade conference will be held in London when he first proposed this last summer...

The mission is headed by W. G. Bennett...

Pharmacists Council Meets

The Atlantic Provinces Pharmaceutical Advisory Council held its first Annual Meeting at the First Cumberland Hotel, Amherst, Nova Scotia, on November 17th, 1957.

This Council which held its first formal meeting in September 1956 was formed by Provincial Pharmaceutical bodies to advise on and coordinate problems of mutual interest to the pharmacists of the Atlantic Provinces.

The Amherst meeting was presided over by G.R. McLean, Dr. Henry New Brunswick who presented a very comprehensive report of the activities of the Council during its first year of operation. Detail relevant to the arrangements for reciprocity of pharmacist certificates within the provinces of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick was discussed and it is planned to implement such an arrangement at the earliest possible date.

Officers elected for 1957-58 are Chairman, W. Stewart Serna, Glace Bay, Nova Scotia; vice-Chairman, John K. Macdonald, Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island; Secretary, E. D. Hines, Bridgewater, Nova Scotia; immediate past President of the Canadian Pharmaceutical Association.

It is planned to hold another meeting early in the new year.
