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Cuban Exiles Fight Police

WASHINGTON (AP)—Thousands of Cuban exiles, chanting "Cuba si, Russia no!" fought Tuesday with police trying to keep them from demonstrating in front of the Pan American Union building in demands for the removal of Fidel Castro dictatorship in Cuba.

Representatives of 20 American embassies meeting in the building considering the question of sanctions against the Havana government because of its alleged attempt to overthrow the government of Venezuela.

"We save Cuba or we lose America," some banners said. "Wake up O.A.S.," said another. "If only we could organize of American States."

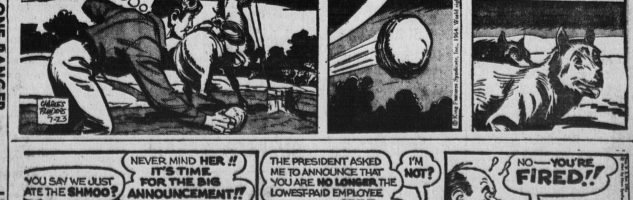
