IN MEMORIAM

LEMUEL H. DRAKE

The death of Lemuel H. Drake, a highly respected resident of Meadowbank, occurred at his home, September 6th. Mr. Drake had been in his usual health until the day of his death when he suffered a heart seizure and died before medical aid could reach him. In his death the community of which he was an outstanding citizen suffered a heavy loss, and the United Church of which he was a valued member was deprived of a faithful servant. For the past number of years Mr. Drake had served on the board of trustees, and at the time of his passing he held the important office of general treasurer of the entire pastoral charge; he was also the secretary of the Official Board of the Church.

Mr. Drake was one of the leading farmers of the district and was widely known as a man of sterling character. His fine gift for friendship won for him a host of friends many of whom were from beyond the bounds of the immediate neighborhood. This was evidenced in the fact that his funeral was one of the largest in this district over a period of years.

Left to mourn his passing are his wife, the former Carrie MacLaren; three sons, Vernon at home; Stewart of Cornwall and Lawson of Cornell University, Ithaca, N.Y.; a brother Edward of Onset, Mass.; two sisters Margaret, Mrs. Richard Drake, Cornwall and Blanche, Mrs. Hector MacLean, New Dominion. Mr. Drake is also survived by three grandchildren to whom he was greatly devoted, Russell, Vivian and Barbara, children of Mr. and Mrs. Stewart Drake, Cornwall.

Funeral services at his home and the graveside were conducted by the Rev. R. A. Patterson, assisted by the Rev. D. A. S. Weir. Interment was in the Church cemetery, Cornwall. The pallbearers were, Roy Crosby, Robert Jewell, Ivan Clow, Gordon MacLean, Thomas Mackinnon and James Miller.

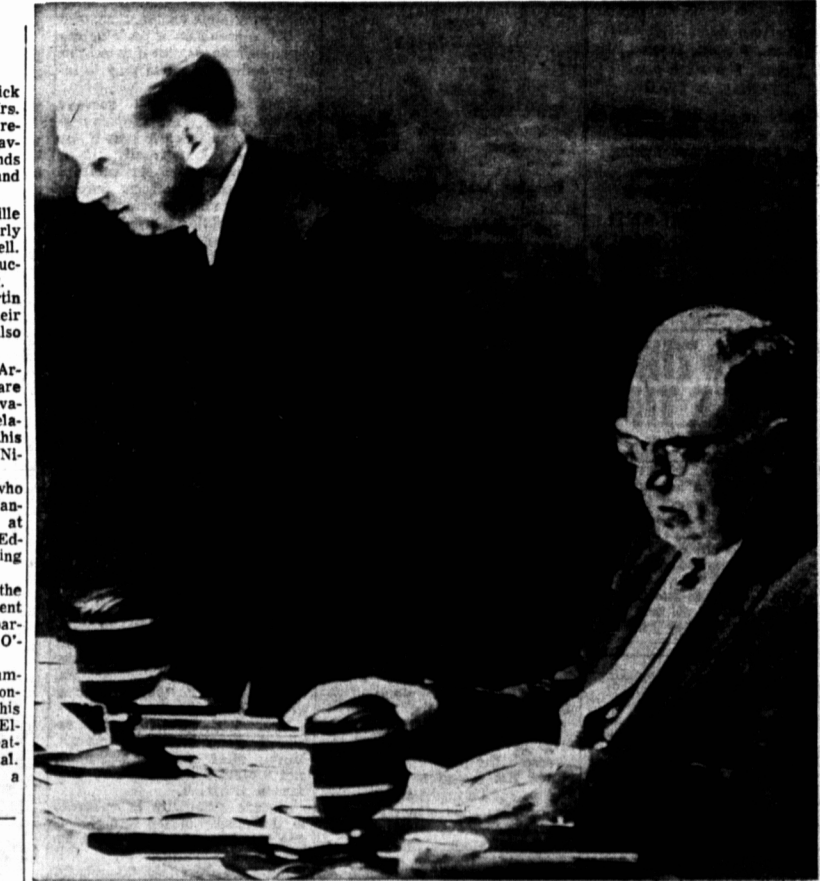
PIUSVILLE
