The children should be encouraged to keep their small savings in the little individual banks that come for that purpose. It teaches a child to take care of his money, and not to spend it foolishly. In one family each child has two banks. For the first six months of the year the pennies collected by every child go into one of his safes, the contents of which are to be put aside for the small owner until he shall be a man — to help start him in business or in his profession, or to aid in putting him through college should the parents' funds fail. All the coins collected during the second half of the year are put into bank number two, which is sacred to Christmas and birthday money. Just before the holidays and the family birthdays every one of the second class of banks is opened and the money it contains given to the small child to whom it belongs, so that he may, with his own savings, purchase gifts for those he loves. Along life's pathway there are many temptations to selfishness, and we cannot too early therefore begin to train our little ones in practical altruism, in self-denial, that others may be happy.—Harper's Bazaar.
