A Late Session—Absence of Minisaers.

OTTAWA, Sept. 14.—Hon. Mr. Tarte has gone to Boston for pointers. From Boston he goes to St. John.

It is reported that Judge Tascherian will succeed Sir Henry Strong as Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Canada in the event of the latter receiving a prominent appointment to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council.

Sergeant Major Hogan, of the Ottawa City police force is to succeed O'Leary as Inspector of the Dominion police.

The Free Press says that the next session of parliament will not commence before the first week of February and assigns the absence of several ministers as the cause of this.

Messrs. Tarte and Fielding are going to England and Mr. Sifton to the Yukon.

SIMLA, Sept. 14.—A police post at Sanhargate was attacked by Orakzas yesterday. A gallant defence was made by the garrison of twenty-one Sikhs. But the fort fell at half-past four, the life of only one Sikh being spared.

Fort Lockhart and Fort Gulistan are still heavily attacked. A relieving force is going forward.

Startling news comes from Fort Lockhart. It is to the effect that the combined body of the Afridis and Orakzas number over 47,000 men.

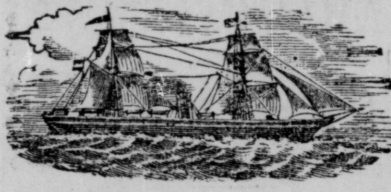
