cord of her former greatness; the time may come that this personage may continue his travels across the Atlantic, and standing on Mason and Dixon's line with his face to the North, may see in Canada a prosperous and contented people, strong in the institutions of an advanced civilization, great in all the essential elements that constitute true glory.

Whist on the South of that line he may look in vain for a vestige of the former prosperity of the adjoining Republic, he may only faintly see a chain of petty states stretching from Maine to Oregon, closely resembling the German principalities at the time of Frederick the Great.

Mr. Daniel Gordon, New Perth, seconded the amendment which was heartily supported by Cyrus Shaw, Esq.

Messrs Wm Kaneen, Jas. D. Dewar, F. G. Boyver, and J. G. Scrimgeour, spoke in opposition to the amendment which was defended by Messrs Hamilton and Shaw.

The question being put from the Chair, the amendment was declared carried by a large majority.

The following resolution was moved by Cyrus Shaw, Esq., seconded by Robert Dewar, Esq., and carried unanimously:

"Resolved, That the fisheries of this province are recognized by our people as being of great value.

Therefore resolved, That this meeting, disapproves of any sacrifice of our fisheries being made in order to secure any Reciprocity Treaty less favorable than that of 1854."

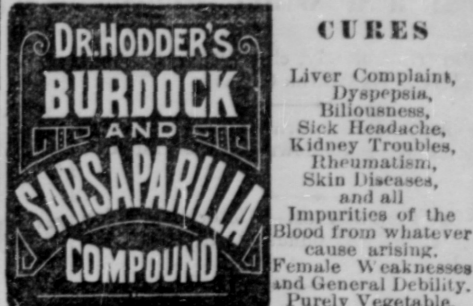
