

Blight Shows
In Spud Crop

In a P.E.I. Potato Bulletin released yesterday, it was disclosed that blight due to weather conditions being favorable to its development. The bulletin prepared by L.C. Calbeck and F.M. Cannon of the Charlottetown Experimental Farm, suggests that farmers to spray all fields as protection against blight. On the Island blight has been found in a cobbler field at Fortune Bridge and, in a cobbler field at Brackley. A field of blight is infected on the north mountain of Nova Scotia's Annapolis Valley. It is very likely that trace infections are present in a few other fields. 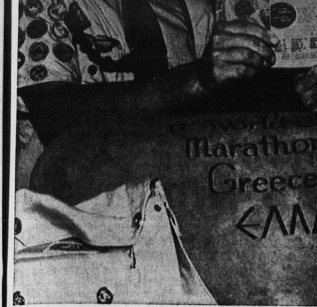

Bottlers Claim Financial Loss

Five Island bottling companies together suffer an annual financial loss of close to \$100,000, due to the "one cent for empties" policy of small stores it was estimated yesterday morning by J. Morris, owner of J. and T. Morris Company Ltd.

Mr. Morris said the loss to his company is \$20,000 a year, and he estimated that of another Charlottetown bottling firm at \$20,000 from unreturned bottles. He attributed this loss directly to the small-store owners, who allow only one cent for returned empties, although spokesmen for the owners said Wednesday the full two cents deposit is given to regular customers returning empty soft drink bottles.

Mr. Morris said the one-cent purchase price offered discourages people from returning bottles to stores and they are thrown away, discarded or broken and are a total loss to the bottling companies. He said the public "just doesn't realize" the financial loss suffered by bottling companies every year.

He said the situation seemed peculiar to Prince Edward Island, pointing out the loss of empties runs to only 15 cents a case here, whereas it is only six cents a case in Ontario. He said the public probably be used more often.
