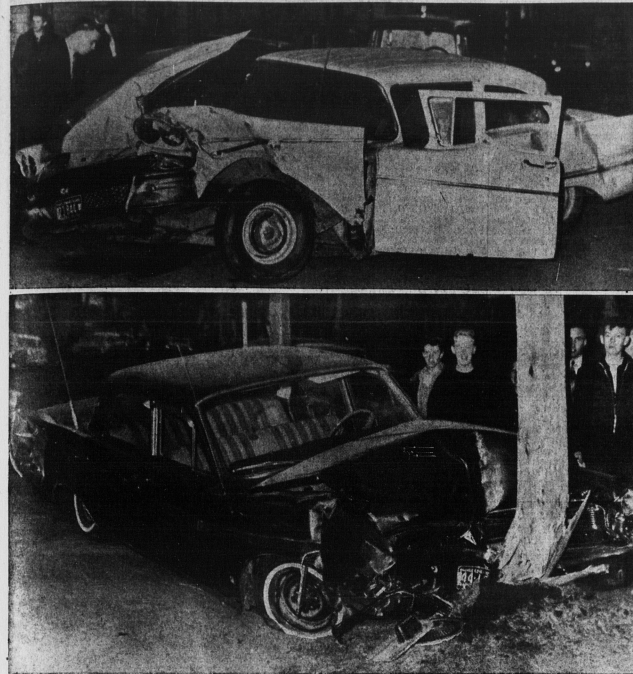

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Kennedy ordered the readjusting of military forces and preliminary steps to call out the Alabama National Guard Sunday night to cope with any renewed racial rioting in Birmingham, Ala.

### Enraged Negroes Riot Following Bombings

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — Thousands of enraged Negroes rioted until daybreak Sunday after bombs damaged the home of a Negro integration leader and a Negro motel.

Nearly 50 persons—some of them police and firemen—were confined to hospital with injuries.

Thousands of dollars in damage was caused by the rampaging crowds who set fire to a Negro residential area. Looting of stores was reported.

A policeman was stabbed twice in the back while taxi driver was dragged from his vehicle and stabbed. His cab was overturned and set afire.

Rocks shattered windshields of police and fire vehicles. The autos of passersby were peppered with rocks. Fires were slashed on parked cars—mostly police vehicles.

**PATROL STREETS**  
Peace returned with the dawn, but heavily armed and reinforced police continued to patrol the streets, giving this industrial community the appearance of a city under siege.

A Negro integration leader Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. said the truce reached by a bi-racial committee Friday would stand despite the rioting. He said the truce, which could end most of the city's rigid segregation practices, would up an intensive desegregation campaign led by King.

### Homes Peppered By Rifle Fire

ANNISTON, Ala. (AP) — Homes of two Negro families and a Negro church here were peppered with rifle fire Sunday, police said. No injuries were reported.

Officers said the home of Jesse Clark was struck by 12 rifle bullets and the home of Tom DeLoach by 10.

Six shots were fired into the St. John's Methodist Church for Negroes, officers said.

## COMMENCEMENT TOMORROW Set New Record

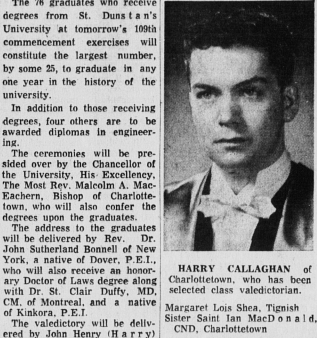
