

MacRae Claims Mechanization Has Reduced Farm Labor Force

"Our aim is to take advantage of every avenue to increase production per acre and with the easily available assistance from the Federal Department of Agriculture, aid our farmers in doing a better job in every sphere of agriculture," Mrs. Andrew MacRae, provincial Minister of Agriculture said in an address to the Rotary luncheon held at the Charlottetown Hotel yesterday. His topic was "Trends of Agriculture in P.E. Island."

"The decrease in the number of people employed in Canadian Agriculture as compared with 25 years ago, has cut the number in half, due chiefly to mechanization taking over and larger farms, the speaker said. "Small farms cannot begin to employ labour for more than 100 to 200 days per year, and they cannot get along on that, with the result that unemployment is a pressing problem."

"Critics of the subsidies accorded to agriculture should know that the C.B.C. budget yearly, far exceeds that of farm assistance," Mr. MacRae stated.

Describing the allocation of acreage in the province, Mr. MacRae stated that grain is counted for 157,500 acres, potatoes 40,000, livestock, 130,000, pasture 166,000, forestry 200,000.

Reforestation "Forestry is not being exploited, fully and is neglected, by failing to replant pulpwood," the speaker said.

"We are trying to get farmers to look after this piece of depreciable asset as they would any other crop. Our soil and moisture is particularly important," Mr. MacRae said.

"We could easily double our present cattle population and should grow the feed necessary to maintain them," he stated.

The speaker also stated that about 500 acres of tobacco had recently been inspected by representatives of the Imperial Tobacco Co., who said that the "Prospects were excellent."

Referring to strawberries, Mr. MacRae noted that very little mechanical work was involved, but that the use of excellent quality for freezing and canning.

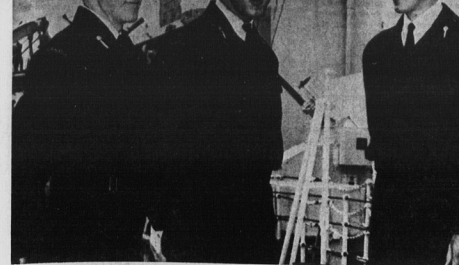
