Remaining Bills Are Introduced

Yesterday's session of the Legislature was taken up with the consideration of legislation in an effort to get several remaining bills out of the way so that Premier Walter R. Shaw could conclude his debate on the budget and the House can begin its consideration of budgetary estimates for the current fiscal year.

JUNIOR FARMERS
Approval in principle was given to a bill promoted by Agriculture Minister Andrew MacRae, which provides enabling legislation for the organization of the province's junior farmers. The Act would allow junior farmers to carry on and operate their business, according to Mr. MacRae, in the same manner as the province's Women's Institutes.

The Act provides that the Lieutenant-Governor in-Council may appoint a supervisor of junior farmers' organizations. Late in the morning, a bill concerning amendments to the School Act and promoted by Dr. George Dewar, minister of education, was in the committee stage.

Flying Object Is Spotted

pulpwood on this island. It's a wonderful resource that now provides employment at 60 mills in the province.

"To help our people get the most out of this industry, we are training forestry department extension workers in New Brunswick. We also hope that training in forestry will be given to some staff members of the department of agriculture and department of education. These trained people will work with our farmers and give advice on the raising and maintenance of wood products."

In concluding his debate on the budget speech, the Premier summed up his observations of the current session by saying "after all it is said and done, rugged and forthright as our declarations may be, strong as are our criticisms, all these if done in the spirit of fairness and honest conviction are all necessary portions of our political life. It is in the closing address of this session, may these fine attributes find expression in the activities carried forward into the laws and policies of this legislature and this government designed to promote the happiness and welfare of our people."

"We have, as legislators, a sacred duty to perform on behalf of those who in turn have entrusted us with their interests. It is our responsibility to see

that that trust shall not be betrayed. Whatever our loyalty to political parties may be and those whom we represent, honored, to the extent that party principles are based on honor and integrity, but nevertheless be necessary to our sacred duty to this province and those whom we represent.

"No great task was ever undertaken without mistakes but I trust in the days ahead, I may be blessed with the wisdom and strength necessary for so great a task and that when the final bell has tolled, it may be said of all of us that 'he did his best for his people in respect of creed or political philosophy, and point to some memorials of services rendered here. May we go forward in that hope. In the spirit of helpfulness and co-operation, and under the guidance of the Great Leader of all, establish, properly, happiness and moral stability among our people.'"

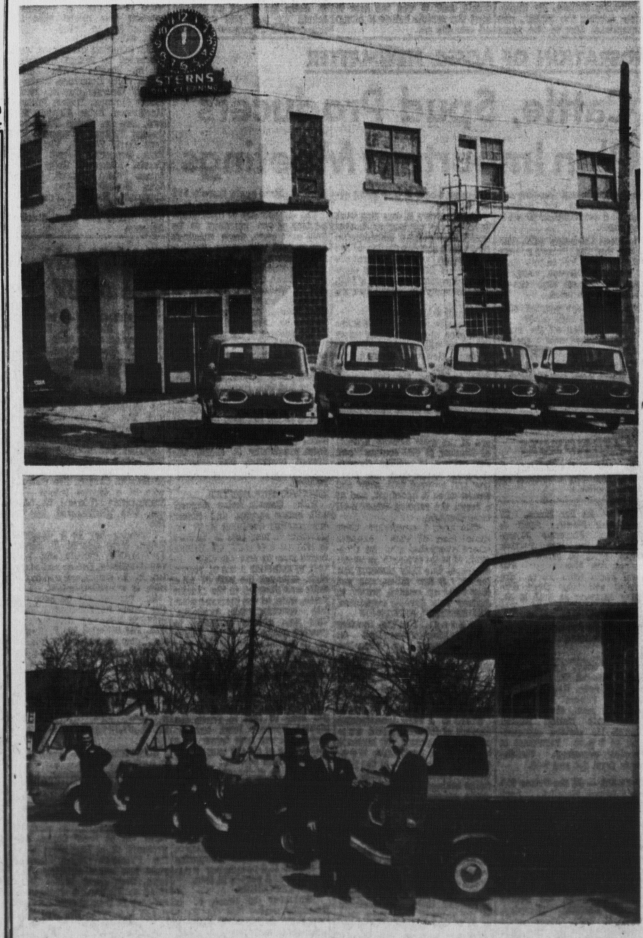
