

THE LOAN BILL—THE IMPERIAL DEMAND FOR PAYMENT OF THE TROOPS.

We understand that the Hon. Mr. Hensley's prospects of obtaining a Loan for this Island are such that by October next, when the holiday season in England will be over, there will be no difficulty in obtaining the money on much more favorable terms than the news by former mails indicated.

This much has been gained by Mr. Hensley's Mission, that the affairs of this Colony have received greater attention at the Colonial Office than ever they did; and the demand made on this Government for the payment of nearly five thousand pounds sterling, expended by the Imperial Government for the maintenance of troops at this place, has been relinquished—a despatch to that effect having been received by the last Mail;—and that, in part, has been rectified the grave error committed by the late Government in bringing troops here for the collection of rents at the expense of the country, and building Barracks which are now nothing but a useless burden.

The present Government did well to resist the demand made upon them, and Mr. Hensley's personal advocacy of the claims of the Colony in the matter shows the great importance of his proceeding on the Mission—which is the only thing of the kind that has ever turned out well for the Colony. The *Islander* sneers at the Delegation—describes it as "a mountain in labour," "the offspring of folly and stupidity," &c., but though it may cost two or three hundred pounds, it has evidently been the means of saving many thousands. The *Islander*, no doubt, feels that the present Delegation comes too favorably for former ones—such as Messrs. Palmer's and Page's mission to England on the Local Commissioners' Report, and the famous expedition to the Brazils. The Local Commissioners' Report, if confirmed, would be a positive evil to the country—as it would force obnoxious terms on the treasury; while the Delegation to Brazil and the West Indies was always looked upon by all classes in the community as one of the maddest of mad schemes. Now the Colony derives two important advantages from Mr. Hensley's mission—the certainty of getting a Loan to purchase out the claims of the proprietors, and the relinquishment of a heavy Imperial debt against the Colony, incurred by the late Government, which certainly would prove a troublesome affair, had not Mr. Hensley proceeded to England. The learned Attorney General will come home with the next English Mail to Halifax, when we shall most probably be put in possession of fuller information on the object of his mission to England.

ELECTIONS IN THE DOMINION.

Some of the Canadian elections have been brought to a conclusion, and the others are now in progress. So far the Ministerialists have carried matters their own way; several of the Cabinet Ministers have been elected, and the Premier, Sir John A. Macdonald, has been returned for Kingston by an overwhelming majority. The Hon. George Brown, the Leader of the Opposition, has been defeated at the election for South Ontario; but it is said that Mr. Brown will try his luck for another constituency, West Peterborough—with what prospects we cannot say. There is not the least doubt now that the Coalition Government will be well sustained in the first Parliament of the Dominion.

The elections in New Brunswick will commence next week. Some time this month, we believe, the elections in Nova Scotia will be held; so that by October next the Dominion Government will be fairly started on what we believe will be a career of progress and prosperity.

The Local Parliament of the Province of Quebec is summoned to meet for the day, date of business on the 24th Sept. inst.

The *Patriot* and *Herald*, during the past week, bestowed some compliments upon us, because we ventured to express our own opinion in this paper, a fortnight ago, to the effect, that if the Dominion Government made just and generous proposals to the Government of this Colony, in a financial way, with the view of embracing us in Confederation, we believed such proposals would be submitted to the country in the usual constitutional manner.

Both the *Patriot* and *Herald* appear to be dreadfully shocked at this mild expression of opinion of ours, as foreshadowing a dissolution of the present Assembly. They may rant and rave as they please—the opinion remains firmly impressed upon our mind, and it is only our opinion; and the *Herald* and *Patriot* must use something better than bluster to show that there is anything unreasonable in it. As far going through the editorials of the *Patriot* and *Herald*, at this pleasant season, when everybody is out of town enjoying his holiday, and commenting upon them in detail, why, we should just as soon think of reading the stale debates of last Session, which Mr. Laird has been serving out as literary pabulum for the last days. It is to be hoped we will see the last of the stuff before winter sets in.

It is rumored in town that the Hon. Edward Kennay, of Halifax, who is now on a visit here, will be appointed President of the Senate at Ottawa, of which he is a member. The choice will be an excellent one, and a graceful compliment to the Irish Catholic population of the Maritime Provinces, among whom Mr. Kennay has long been recognized as a representative man; besides, his great experience as President of the Legislative Council of Nova Scotia eminently qualifies him for the high position to which he is about being called. Mr. Kennay's elevation as head of the Senate will cause a vacancy in the Dominion Government, which Dr. Tupper will, no doubt, be invited to fill.

We have been out of town most of the past week, at the sea shore, enjoying the healthful breezes of one of the most interesting watering places in the Island, Stanhope;—and while there we had good-bye to editorial duties, which were abandoned for the scantiness of editorial matter in the present No.; but even had we been home, we could scarcely have found any thing to write about; local politics were never so quiet—to use a commercial phrase—as they are at present.

Up to this time three of the Dominion Ministers have been elected, Mr. John A. Macdonald, the Premier, who handsomely beat his opponent, Mr. McLaughlin, the Minister of Public Works; and Mr. Langavon, the Secretary of State. The two latter were unopposed. Mr. Gibble's majority over Mr. Brown is reduced to 76.

The police authorities of London telegraphed to the authorities of Portsmouth two hundred thirty-five men, to attend a Portdown fair. An army of three hundred in London, and they invade the province in organized detachments.

Port Hood.—The intercourse between this port, Port Hood and Sydney, is largely on horseback; fifty passengers were on board on her return to Sydney, and to have found the performance of the Steamer *Ernest* of Wales and the uniform courtesy and kindness of the gentlemanly commander, Captain Evans.—*Pictorial Standard*.

Gen. Grant is daily justifying the public expectation of the ability with which he performs his public duties. He has found several public duties to be easier than he had expected, and he has instructed them out of the service. He found a needless multiplication of offices and office-holders, and he is rapidly reducing them to a peace footing.

Late Denver papers report that Forts Reno and Pike's Canyon are in a state of siege, and that all parties leaving them are immediately classed black and blacked stock. Col. Crook had lost 400 head of Cheyenne ponies from Aspers to Fort Pike's Canyon; it is impossible, except for large parties, and even they are frequently attacked.

Louis Carroll, Esq., has been appointed Superintendent of the R. & N. A. Railway, J. Edward Boyd, Esq., having resigned the position.—*John Globe*.

The Government at Washington has discovered an extraordinary fraud perpetrated by treacherous Government employees in the collection of the war tax. Steps are being taken to ferret out the guilty parties and bring them to punishment. Eight hundred tons of shells have been returned to Washington to be unfilled and stockpiled.

The Liverpool *Advertiser* states that a servant girl, residing in a family near that town, had unexpectedly come into a fortune of £1,000,000 by the death of a relative in a British colony.

The Philadelphia *American* says in its twentieth week of this city alone are, in various parts of the continent, 7,711 families of the pressed brick, with white marble trimmings, and all respects with modern conveniences and comfort. In the twenty-first week building is progressing on pretty much the same scale.

The *Liberty* announces a fact which it says has not received the attention it deserves. The Alps no longer separate Italy and Germany. The first locomotive has crossed the mountain of St. Gothard, in thirty-five hours from Frankfurt. Venice is thirty-five hours from London.

On the 14th inst. there were a thousand cases of yellow fever in Galveston, Texas. The Internal Revenue office has been closed, all the employees being down with the fever.
