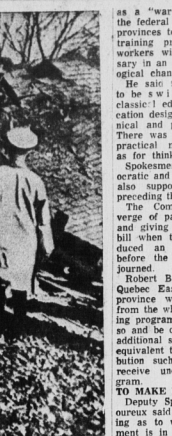

Starr Stresses Canadian Need For Doers As Well As Thinkers

OTTAWA (CP)—Former Conservative labor minister Michael Starr said Canada's education system must produce "doers" as well as thinkers. He stressed the need for practical men and women who can get things done. Starr, who was minister of education from 1957 to 1962, said that while Canada has many excellent technical schools, it lacks the practical training and experience that is needed in the workforce. He called for a shift in focus towards vocational and technical education, arguing that this is essential for the country's economic growth and development.
