No Legal Bar of Quebec To Separate

TORONTO (CP)—An international law expert says there is "neither a legal nor a moral right to stop Quebec from separating from the rest of Canada."

Prof. Edward McWhinney of the University of Toronto's law faculty said he cannot see how law can deny separation to Quebec even if one believes they are wrong, when we see freedom being given to the people in Africa and Asia. "I sincerely come to the conclusion (to separate) we should not stand in the way," he told the law faculty conference on law and world affairs.

There will be no sudden

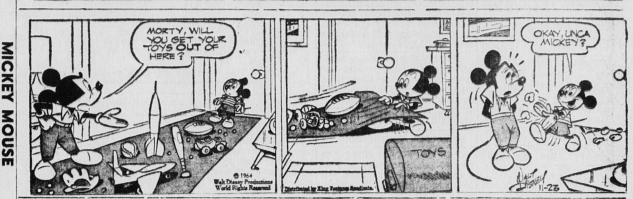
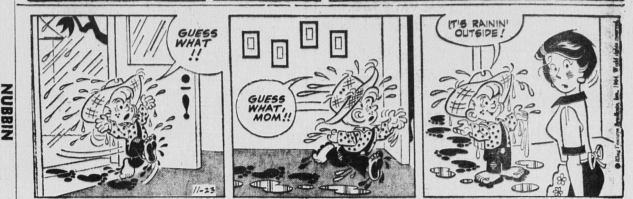
