On the darkest night there will be a friendly glow over the premises. The glass sides are four basement windows. The curved rafters and the roofing sections are cut from a pattern which includes details for fitting the cupola to the roof. Either a barn or a railroad lantern is wired with fittings from the hardware store. The chandelier weathervane and an American Indian tracing design are on pattern 241. Patterns are 35 cents each. CONTRACT BRIDGE

South dealer. North-South vulnerable.

NORTH

The bidding:
South West North East
1♣ Pass 3♣ Pass
4NT Pass 5♦ Pass
5NT Pass 6♦ Pass

Opening lead—king of spades. South's intense interest in getting to a grand slam, as evidenced by his bidding, was well founded. Though the investigation proved to be fruitless, it was nevertheless justified. Once North had responded with three diamonds and followed by revealing two aces in response to the four notrump bid, South was properly curious as to the number of kings.

He was willing to undertake seven diamonds if North's response to five notrump turned out to be six hearts, showing two kings. In that case, if North had the red kings, there could be no losers, while if the kings were in spades and diamonds, one heart

loser could go off on the spade king and the other on the ace of clubs, provided North had as many as three clubs.

As matters turned out, with North having only one king and only two clubs, South had his hands full making six. The contract play to assure the slam is not immediately obvious, even if the opponents' cards are known. South found the answer and carried it through all the way, but the casual declarer might thoughtlessly overlook the one telling stroke that is required.

After winning the ace of spades, the question is how to avoid the risk of losing two heart tricks. If declarer eliminates both spades and clubs from dummy's hand and his own, he is still subject to defeat when he leads a heart from dummy in the hope that West will be endplayed. (Had South followed this course of play, he would have been defeated.)

South led a diamond to the king and trumped the six of spades. He then cashed two clubs, ending in dummy. The jack of spades was next led, and instead of trumping it, South discarded the five of hearts. The heart was bound to be a loser in any case, but by disposing of it on the spade jack, he nailed down the contract securely.

West took the queen of spades, but it left her in a hopeless position. Any club she could lead would be discarded. Discarding a loser on a loser made South a winner.
