

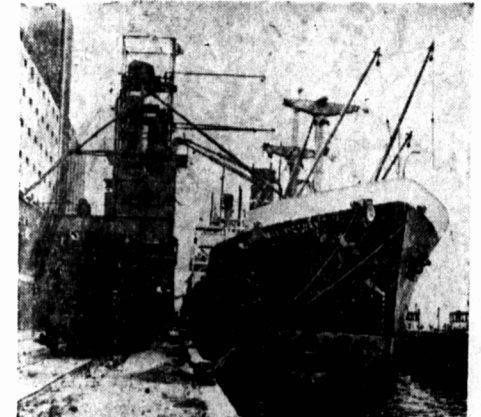


IN DAD'S FOOTSTEPS

Final Verdict On Suez Will Not Come For Years

U.S. Secretary of State Dulles will look like a boob if the verdict of history agrees with one just rendered by Senator William Fulbright of Arkansas.
The senator blasted Dulles—in a speech to the U.S. Senate Wednesday—for his handling of Egyptian President Nasser who retaliated by seizing the Suez Canal. The seizure of the canal led to last year's Middle East war.
There won't be a final verdict for years: Until the documents showing Dulles' policy on Egypt are finally opened to the public. But Fulbright has just examined many of those documents as chairman of a Senate subcommittee which studied U.S. Middle East policy since 1945.
This is the brief background: For years Egypt had wanted to build the Aswan Dam which would take the country out of the middle ages by developing irrigation and power for industry. The project was found to be sound. Egypt said it would pay most of the cost but needed outside help. Russia offered the help. So did the United States. The U.S.

Wheat Stockpile Figures Underestimated For Years

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada's mountainous wheat stockpile is officially estimated by the bureau of statistics at an unprecedented 725,000,000 bushels but Prairie pools challenge that figure, maintaining it is between 90,000,000 and 100,000,000 bushels too high.
The bureau, in reporting Friday its new figure as the stockpile at the close of the crop year July 31, indicated that on the basis of census surveys it has been underestimating the wheat crop for some years. It planned upward revisions in production figures back to 1952.
But the pools charged that the bureau was overestimating rather than underestimating. A Saskatchewan pool spokesman said at Regina that the official figure of 10,000,000 bushels too high. At Winnipeg, W. J. Parker, president of the Manitoba Pool Elevators, said official figures on farm-held stocks were overestimated by 90,000,000.
The estimated carryover of 722,967,000 bushels was far higher than federal officials had anticipated. It was 143,393,000 bushels higher than the revised carryover estimate for last year.

Fast Work On Stolen Truck

RCMP from the Summerside detachment on Saturday night located a stolen half-ton truck even before the owner was aware that the vehicle was missing.
While patrolling in the Miscouche area about 11:30 p.m. the RCMP stopped a truck to make a routine check and discovered that the driver had no licence and had stolen the truck, a 1954 half-ton Mercury belonging to Polycarp Arsenault of St. Chrysostom, which had been taken from Water Street a short time earlier.
At the moment that the anxious owner walked into the Summerside Police Station to report the theft, the RCMP arrived with both the stolen vehicle and the car-thief.

P.-C. Organizer Said Year Before, Quebec Not Needed

OTTAWA (CP)—An old political belief that Quebec support is necessary for a party to win a Canadian general election was attacked by Trade Minister Gordon Churchill in an analysis he wrote more than a year before the balloting last June.
This just isn't so, says the man who laid the organizational groundwork for the Progressive Conservative party's campaign in the June 10 Dominion election. He said in a recent interview that his study of federal elections since Confederation, described in a paper he drew up in January, 1956, convinced him that the Maritimes, Ontario and the West—not Quebec—are the areas that decide whether governments change in Ottawa.
MEMBERS IMPRESSED
Other members of his party were impressed. While not ignoring Quebec—where the Conservatives had been consistently unsuccessful for years—"we put the emphasis on the areas where we had the best hope of success," Mr. Churchill said.
In his 1956 paper, Mr. Churchill wrote: "If 60 (additional) seats are won in that good fighting territory (the Maritimes, Ontario and the West), a minority government can be formed. If Quebec produces a gain of 20 seats a government with an over-all majority would be assured."
SUBSTANTIAL GAIN
The June election brought the Conservatives 60 new seats—four from Quebec. The outcome gave the Conservatives 111 of the 265 Commons seats, not a majority, but enough to form a minority government as the largest party group.
Mr. Churchill's analysis of the 21 general elections since 1867 showed that the existing government was re-elected in 12, defeated in nine.
The statement is frequently made that you cannot govern the country without Quebec and to this statement there is no serious disagreement, for in the interests of national unity all parts of Canada should be represented in the government," Mr. Churchill wrote.
But he concluded: "A considerable element of optimism is required to expect either a substantial change in Quebec in favor of the Conservatives at the next (June 10) election or that a change of government will be brought about by a shift in voting strength in Quebec."
"Quebec has produced a change in government on only one occasion, in 1896, and then it was to the Liberals. . . . Except for 1896 the other eight changes in the government of Canada have resulted from the action of the voters in Ontario, the Maritimes and the West. . . . Those areas then would appear to present the real battleground for the next election. Quebec should not be ignored but it is extremely doubtful that Quebec should not be ignored but it is extremely doubtful that Quebec will be decisive. The military maxim 'reinforce success, not failure' might well be considered as applicable to political strategy. . . . A (Conservative) gain of 84 seats would ensure an over-all majority of eight, exclusive of the Speaker. A loss of 60 seats by the Liberals to the Conservatives would make the Conservatives the strongest party in the House and give them the government, a minority government but likely to endure with the support of splinter groups and independents. "Where are those seats to be found? From the history of political changes in Canada, Ontario, the Maritimes and the West would appear to be the most likely sources."
