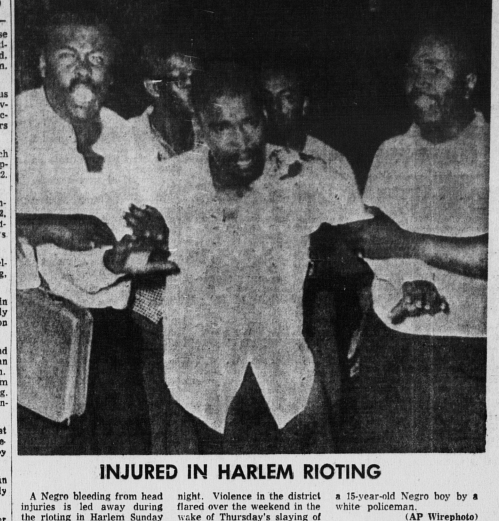

Memory of Emperor Franz Josef Continues To Haunt Austria

Ferdinand, was assassinated at Sarajevo in the incident that sparked the First World War. Yet the man with the moustache whiskers, who ruled Austria for 68 years, still haunts its memories, was to be spared great calamities and indignities. He died in 1916 at the age of 86, two years before the break-up of his empire.

He never dreamed that most of his empire would one day slip into Communist rule. EMPEROR'S EMPEROR - Franz Josef was the acknowledged "emperor's emperor," a ramrod man whose court was an enchanting, extravaganza of a former Viennese Burgtheater. She had returned briefly to comfort Franz Josef after the debacle at Konigsgratz, and again in 1908 after their son Rudolf killed the Baroness Maria Vetsera and himself in their death pact at the Mayerling hunting lodge.

But while she deserted him for years on end, Empress Sisi left Franz Josef to be comforted by Katerina (Kathy) Schraut—an enchanting, extravaganza actress from Vienna's Burgtheater. She had returned briefly to comfort Franz Josef after the debacle at Konigsgratz, and again in 1908 after their son Rudolf killed the Baroness Maria Vetsera and himself in their death pact at the Mayerling hunting lodge.

When Rudolf died, Franz Josef apparently became convinced that the dynasty was coming to an end. But true to his honor-bound code, he felt the Hapsburgs must go down like gentlemen, colors flying. He was still to rule for 28 years, with troubles mounting.

He repeated the same mistakes, with an iron constance always with nighty prayers, convinced he was doing the correct and honorable thing. For instance, to get rid of the body of Maria Vetsera after Rudolf's funeral, Franz Josef permitted this. Her body was placed in a coach, which was pulled in a closed night, and held upright between her two uncles to be taken to the ancient monastery of Heiligenkreuz.

BURIED OUT OF SIGHT - And when the bodies of Franz Ferdinand and his morganatic wife, Sophie Chokov, were brought to the capital, they were also buried out of sight, and again in a temporary vault. Franz Josef was often distracted by bickering between Sophie and Elizabeth.

OPEN DISCONTENT - His private life's breaking down and his army being led by an ally against Franz Josef returned to Vienna to find discontent openly displayed. In 1914, Franz Josef was maneuvered by Prince-Bismarck into a war with Prussia. His last years in Germany, with the loss of his Baltic possessions.

Helmut von Moltke crushed the Austrians at Konigsgratz in 1866. In 1867, Prince-Bismarck did there was the forerunner of what Prussian-Germany was to do in 1914. He was often distracted by bickering between Sophie and Elizabeth.

The victory at Konigsgratz made Prussia the No. 1 German power in Europe. But Bismarck did not march on Vienna and destroy Austria. He lined up as an ally against Franz Josef at the age of 37. Franz Josef had fallen with Italy, with Germany and with Hungary. All these years the ravishing Sisi had been alluringly restless over Europe. He wrote her pleading letters addressed to "my endlessly beloved angel" and signed "your lonely
