**Critics Of CBC Are Recruited**

**TORONTO (CP)**—CBC director Kate Aitken is recruiting 2,000 armchair critics whose likes and dislikes will probably dictate the organization's future program content.

Mrs. Aitken says she hit on the idea of amateur critics from private life because of dissatisfaction with professional researchers and their surveys.

The critics from all income brackets and walks of life will be chosen in 402 municipalities from coast to coast by service club representatives, mayors and Reeves and religious groups.

The idea has been accepted by the CBC program-finance committee and by the organization's management, Mrs. Aitken said.

She said TV and radio programs will be expanded, shortened or dropped on the basis of the response from the critics.

CBC audience research departments will mail cards to the participants. A total of 16,000 have already agreed to take part.

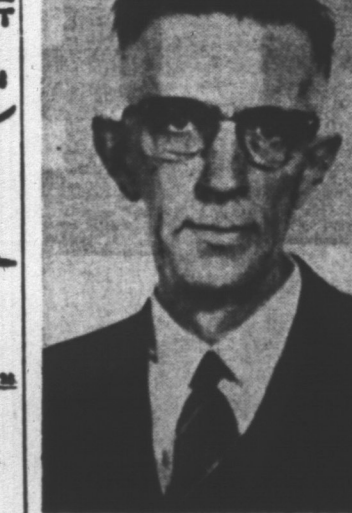

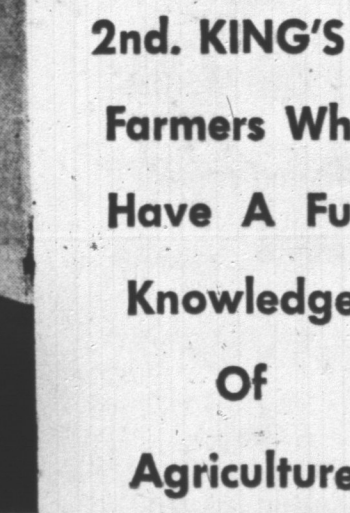
