

### IN MEMORIAM

#### EDWIN HECKBERT

The sudden and unexpected death of Edwin Heckbert at his home in Summerside on June 16, at the early age of 29, came as a shocking sadness to his host of friends in Summerside and throughout Prince County, as well as in many other parts of the Maritimes and wherever he was known.

One of the leading and most highly skilled photographers in the Province, Mr. Heckbert was also one of Summerside's most popular and successful young business men.

Always kind and helpful, his gentle, pleasant manner made him an endeared friend of all with whom he was acquainted. In his devotion to his family he was a loving father and husband. In his business the achievement of perfection was always his objective.

Returning to his home in late afternoon of Wednesday, June 16, from an assignment in which he photographed the presentation of Bibles, he suddenly suffered a cerebral haemorrhage and passed away a few hours later.

Born in Summerside in 1924, he spent most of his life here, and in addition to his association with photographic organizations, was a member of the Summerside Kinsman Club, and the Summerside branch of the Canadian Legion.

After graduation from Summerside High School he was employed at Summerside and Halifax in the photo-engraving trade before opening the De Luxe Photo Service in Summerside. With the beginning of World War II he enlisted in the Navy and served in active sea duty on H.M.C.S. Bowmanville and H.M.C.S. Ontario.

In continuing his chosen career after the war he won top honors in his graduation class at a photography college in Toronto, Ontario, and returned to Summerside in 1947, and established the Edwin Heckbert Studio on Harvard Street.

Left to mourn his loss are his widow, the former Bernadette Palmer of Kinkora, and four sons, Danny, Garry, Gregory, and Brian. Also his parents Mr. and Mrs. Earle Heckbert, a brother Ralph, and a sister Doris, all of Summerside.

His funeral, which was one of the largest ever seen in Summerside, was conducted by his pastor, Rev. C. D. Matheson on Saturday, June 19, with a private service at the Bowness Funeral Home followed by service at Trinity United Church at 2 p.m., at which a very large number of relatives and friends gathered in sorrowing tribute to the loss of one so dearly loved and respected, and the profession of floral tributes added testimony to the esteem in which he was held by all who knew him.

Hymns sung were "Safe In The Arms of Jesus", and "O Safe To The Rock", and a solo, "Some Day We'll Understand" was beautifully sung by Mr. Albert Huestis. Interment was in the People's Cemetery at Summerside. Pall bearers were Messrs. Shelton Harris, Herbert Stright, Wendell Stewart Lloyd Clow, Rene Blais, Russell Phaneuf.

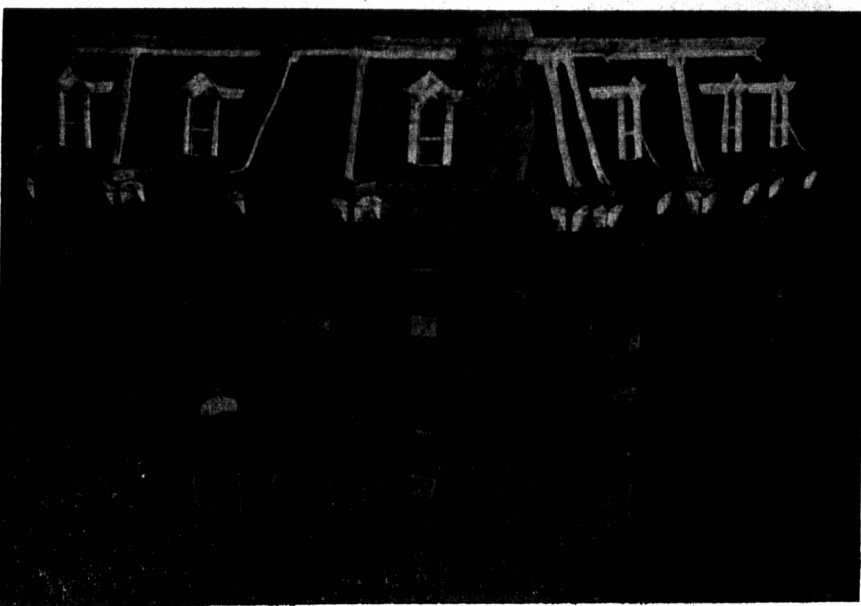

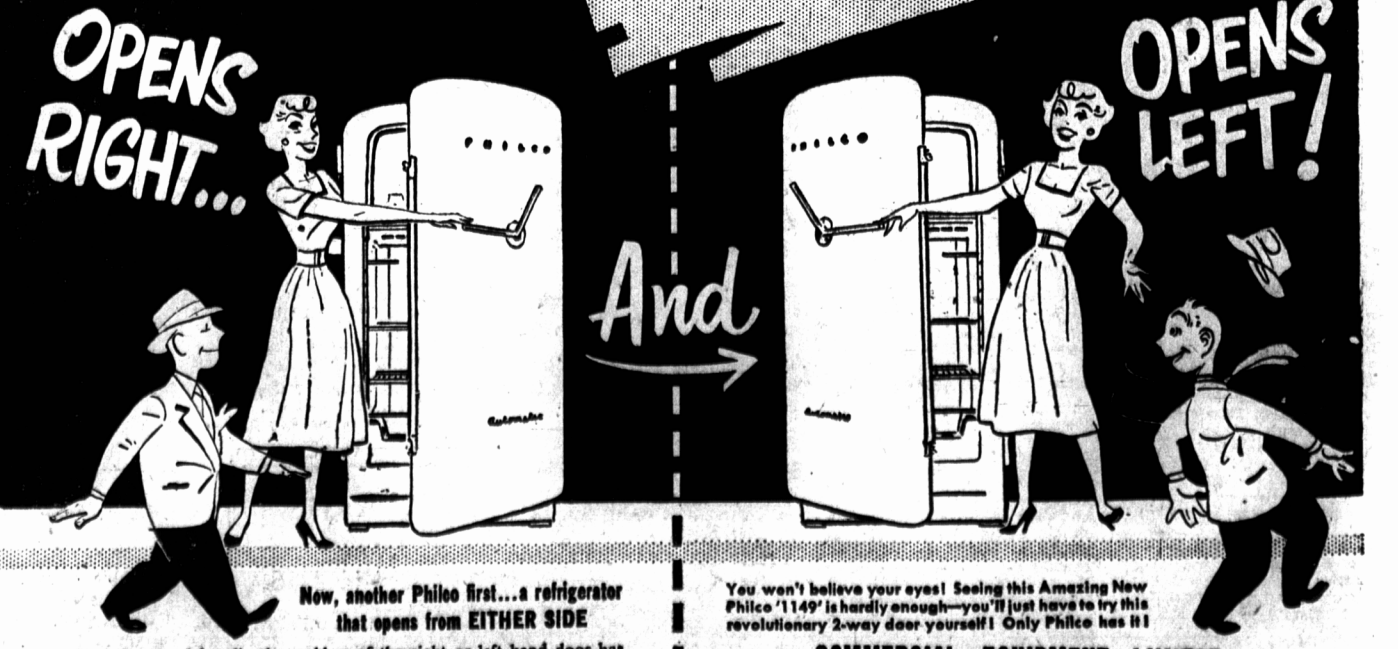
