

Newfoundland Play Mirrors Island Concerns

When Newfoundlanders Berni Stapleton and Amy House take to the stage at the Carrefour Theatre this Thursday, they will be dealing with issues all too familiar to Islanders. *A Tidy Package* is a play about the fishery crisis in Newfoundland, and how it affects the lives of two women who have lost their fish plant jobs because of it. Though the circumstances are somewhat different here on PEI, people in communities such as Souris where the fish plant burned down have been faced with the same kinds of problems, and the play deals with some of the more universal problems faced by the women in the fishery as well.

A Tidy Package was a huge success in Newfoundland, garnering rave reviews and packing houses right across the province. Berni Stapleton, who stars in the play, was last seen in Charlottetown as a featured performer at the Ladies Room Festival in July. She is currently one of Newfoundland's hottest writers and directors.

A Tidy Package will be performed at the Carrefour Theatre on Thursday, November 23 at 8:00 pm. Tickets can be purchased at the Confederation Center box office, or by calling 566-1267.

3:00-5ish	Shakespeare out of the Hat Play: A Midsummer Night's Dream
5:00-7:59	Tag-team reading Prompter: Charity Becker
7:59	Last speech, from The Tempest: Our revels now are ended.
