

TEMPERANCE LEGISLATION.—A number of gentlemen representing the various temperance organizations throughout the province met in consultation with Premier Farquharson and his colleagues yesterday concerning the proposed Temperance Bill. The bill, we understand, aims at prohibiting the retail sale of intoxicating liquors except for medicinal, mechanical and sacramental purposes, liquors to be obtained only through vendors appointed by the Government. The bill also provides for the regulation of the wholesale trade. The Premier afforded the delegates a full and free discussion from 3 to 6 o'clock.
